SPECIAL ORDER DATED 8TH MARCH, 1932, MADE BY THE NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE JOINT COMMITTEE AND THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR FOR NORTHERN IRELAND ACTING JOINTLY UNDER PARAGRAPH (m) OF PART II. OF THE FIRST SCHEDULE TO THE NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE ACT, 1924.

The National Health Insurance Joint Committee and the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland acting jointly in pursurance of the powers conferred on them by paragraph (m) of Part II. of the First Schedule to the National Health Insurance Act, 1924, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf hereby make the following Special Order:—

- 1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the National Health Insurance (Subsidiary Employments) Amendment Order (Northern Ireland), 1932, and shall be read as one with the National Health Insurance (Subsidiary Employments) Order (Northern Ireland), 1931 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal order");
 - (2) This Order shall come into operation on 4th July, 1932:
- (3) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 2. Part VI. of the First Schedule to the principal Order which relates to employment in theatres, etc., shall be read and have effect as if for the words "(a) less than 28 hours' service weekly, and (b) less than 4 hours'" in the first and second lines thereof, there were substituted the words "(a) not more than 28 hours' service weekly, and (b) not more than 6 hours."
