ABERCORN.

Whereas it is provided by section nineteen of the Marketing of Fruit Act (Northern Ireland), 1931 (in this Order referred to as "the Act") that the Act shall come into operation on the appointed day, and that the appointed day for the purposes of the Act shall be such day as the Governor of Northern Ireland may by Order in Council appoint either generally or with reference to any particular provision of the Act, and that different days may be appointed for different purposes and for different provisions of the Act:

Now I, James Albert Edward, Duke of Abercorn, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, Knight of the Most Illustrious Order of Saint Patrick, Governor of Northern Ireland, by and with the advice of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland, do hereby order as follows:—

- 1. I appoint the third day of October, 1931, as the appointed day for the purposes of the provisions of the Act relative to the granting of licences and permits and the making of rules.
- 2. I appoint the first day of November, 1931, as the appointed day for the purposes of the remaining provisions of the Act, except the provisions of Part I of the Act relative to fruit other than apples.
