THE ROYAL ULSTER CONSTABULARY PAY (NEW ENTRANTS)  
(TEMPORARY PROVISIONS) ORDER, 1932, DATED 6TH JULY,  
1932.

I, the Right Honourable Sir Richard Dawson Bates, Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by Section 2 of the Constabulary Act (Northern Ireland), 1922, and by Sub-section (1) of Section 4 of the Constabulary and Police (Ireland) Act, 1919, as applied by the said Act of 1922, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, do hereby Order that the pay of Constables appointed to the Royal Ulster Constabulary from the 1st July, 1932, until further provision is made, shall be in accordance with the rates, scale and conditions prescribed in the Schedule hereto :

And I certify that Sub-section (2) of Section 4 of the Constabulary and Police (Ireland) Act, 1919, which provides that a draft of any Order proposed to be made under the said Section shall be submitted to the representative body or bodies constituted by the Act, and representing any rank or ranks affected, and that before making the Order the Ministry of Home Affairs shall consider any representations made by such body or bodies, has been fully observed :

This Order may be cited as the Royal Ulster Constabulary Pay (New Entrants) (Temporary Provisions) Order, 1932.

## SCHEDULE REFERRED TO IN THE FOREGOING ORDER.

1. *Pay :*

On appointment .. .. .	55/- weekly.
After 1 year from appointment .. ..	57/6 „
After 2 years and until 3 years from appointment	60/- „

2. On appointment the Constable shall be on probation for a period of two years.

3. During the period of probation the services of any Constable may be dispensed with, should they prove unsatisfactory.

4. During the period of probation each increment of pay shall be subject to the approval of the Inspector General, after a report as to the Constable's progress and efficiency.

5. The pay prescribed in this Schedule shall be subject in every case to a deduction at the rate of five per cent. as a contribution towards the general pension charge of the Royal Ulster Constabulary.

6. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 2 of the Constabulary and Police (Ireland) Act, 1883, no deduction in respect of barrack accommodation shall be made from the pay prescribed in this Schedule in the case of any member of the Royal Ulster Constabulary.
