## ABERCORN.

In pursuance of the powers vested in me by the Superannuation (Prison Officers) Act, 1919, as that Act applies in Northern Ireland as well under and in pursuance of the provisions of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, and the enactments amending the same, as under the provisions of the Superannuation Acts (Northern Ireland) 1921 to 1925, and of all other powers thereunto enabling me, I, James Albert Edward, Duke of Abercorn, Governor of Northern Ireland, with the approval of the Ministry of Finance do hereby prescribe that the Superannuation Acts, 1834 to 1914, shall, in their application to the following classes of officers employed in Prisons in Northern Ireland, have effect and be deemed as from the 1st day of December, 1921, to have had effect, subject to the modifications contained in and provided by the said Superannuation (Prison Officers) Act, 1919, namely:—

And I do hereby, with the same approval, revoke any prescription heretofore made under the said Act of 1919 and applicable in Northern Ireland, but without prejudice to the operation of any such prescription previously to the issue of these presents.
