In pursuance of the powers vested in me by the Criminal Lunatics Act (Northern Ireland), 1929, the Superannuation (Prison Officers) Act, 1919, as that Act applies in Northern Ireland, as well under and in pursuance of the provisions of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, and the enactments amending the same, as under the provisions of the Superannuation Acts (Northern Ireland), 1921 to 1925, and of all other powers thereunto enabling me, I, James Albert Edward, Duke of Abercorn, Governor of Northern Ireland, with the approval of the Ministry of Finance, do hereby prescribe that the Superannuation Acts, 1834 to 1914, shall, in their application to the following classes of officers employed in the Criminal Lunatic Asylum in Northern Ireland, have effect, subject to the modifications contained in and provided by the said Superannuation (Prison Officers) Act, 1919, namely:—
