Companies to which section 338 of the Companies Act (Northern Ireland), 1932, applies, that is to say :---

The Treasury Regulations, dated 31st January, 1901, in so far as they relate to matters within the powers of the Parliament and Government of Northern Ireland; and

The Regulations made by the Ministry, dated 10th July, 1922.

3. These Regulations shall come into force on the 7th day of January, 1933.

Reward Fund.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE UNDER SECTION 4 OF THE CONSTABULARY ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1922.

1933. No. 67.

The Ministry of Finance in exercise of the powers conferred upon the said Ministry by sub-section (5) of section 4 of the Constabulary Act (N.I.), 1922 (as amended by section 4 of the Constabulary Act (N.I.), 1928, and the Constabulary Act (N.I.), 1930), and by section 20 of the Exchequer and Audit Act, 1921, hereby makes the following regulations :---

1. These regulations may be cited as the Royal Ulster Constabulary Reward Fund (Amending) Regulations, 1933.

2. Paragraph (b) of regulation 8 of the Royal Ulster Constabulary Reward Fund Regulations, 1929 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations") is hereby revoked.

3. The following regulation shall be substituted for regulation 9 of the principal Regulations :---

"9. The fines imposed on officers or constables, as referred to in regulation 8 (a) shall be paid to the District Inspector and shall be credited by him to his public Account, from which they will be transferred by the Ministry of Home Affairs to the credit of the Fund."
