

II. *Amendment of the Marketing of Eggs Rules  
(Northern Ireland), 1931.*

The Marketing of Eggs Rules (Northern Ireland) 1931, (Statutory Rules and Orders of Northern Ireland No. 91 of 1931) shall be read as if, in Article IX (Testing) paragraph (1) and in Article XVI (Marking of Cases) paragraph (5) the words "the month of February" were substituted for the words "the months of February and March."

III. Commencement.

These Rules shall come into operation on the first day of March, 1933.

IV. *General.*

The Ministry may from time to time rescind, amend or vary these Rules, or any of them as the occasion may require.

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**Arbitrator's Award Regulations.**

THE ELECTRICITY (ARBITRATOR'S AWARD) REGULATIONS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1933, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER THE ELECTRICITY (SUPPLY) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1931.

1933. No. 78.

The Ministry of Commerce for Northern Ireland in exercise of the powers conferred by paragraph (b) of sub-section (1) of section 33 of the Electricity (Supply) Act (Northern Ireland), 1931, hereby makes the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Electricity (Arbitrator's Award) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1933.

2. An Arbitrator appointed under the provisions of section 33 of the Electricity (Supply) Act (Northern Ireland), 1931, to determine any matter shall complete and give notice in writing of the completion of his award to the Electricity Board for Northern Ireland and to the undertakers concerned within two calendar months from the date of the conclusion of the hearing of the case.

3. Upon payment by either party to the proceedings of the Arbitrator's fees and expenses the Arbitrator shall deliver a certified copy of his award to each party.

### Church Temporalities Sinking Fund.

THE CHURCH TEMPORALITIES SINKING FUND REGULATIONS, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE UNDER SUB-SECTION (2) OF SECTION 3 OF THE EXCHEQUER AND FINANCIAL PROVISIONS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1923.

1933. No. 39.

WHEREAS it is provided by Section 3 of the Exchequer and Financial Provisions Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, that there shall be charged upon the Consolidated Fund in each financial year such sums as the Ministry of Finance (hereinafter referred to as the Ministry) may certify from time to time to be necessary to be set aside as respects that financial year for the purpose of securing such fixed revenue in perpetuity as may be actuarially ascertained to be equivalent to the varying terminable revenues which accrue to the Exchequer under Section thirty-one of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920 (which revenue is hereinafter referred to as the fixed revenue) :

And whereas it is further provided that any sums so certified shall be issued from the Consolidated Fund to such Account of the Ministry, at such times, and shall be invested, accumulated and applied in such manner, as may be prescribed.

And whereas the account so prescribed is known as the Church Temporalities Sinking Fund (hereinafter referred to as the Sinking Fund) :

Now the Ministry in exercise of the foregoing powers hereby prescribes as follows :—

1.—(1) The Ministry may from time to time, and in such manner as it may determine, invest any moneys standing to the credit of the Sinking Fund, and may vary such investments.
