## Exempt and Excepted Persons.

REGULATIONS DATED 8TH MAY, 1933, MADE BY THE NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE JOINT COMMITTEE IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE UNDER THE WIDOWS', ORPHANS', AND OLD AGE CONTRIBUTORY PENSIONS ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1925 TO 1932.

1933. No. 98.

The National Health Insurance Joint Committee, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by sub-section (2) of section 14 of the Widows', Orphans', and Old Age Contributory Pensions Act (Northern Ireland), 1925, as amended by section 12 of, and the Second Schedule to, the National Health Insurance Act (Northern Ireland), 1930, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, and in conjunction with the Ministry of Finance, hereby make the following Regulations:

- 1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Contributory Pensions (Exempt and Excepted Persons) Amendment Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1933, and shall be read as one with the Contributory Pensions (Exempt and Excepted Persons) Consolidated Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1932 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations").
- (2) These Regulations shall be deemed to have had effect from and including the 1st day of January, 1933.
- 2. The following proviso shall be added to Article 3 of the principal Regulations:—
  - "Provided that if a person, while deemed to continue to be insured by virtue of the foregoing provision of this Article again becomes employed, within the meaning of the Insurance Act, he shall not, on ceasing to be so employed, be deemed to continue to be insured for any longer period than that for which he would have been deemed if he had not again become employed, unless—
    - (i) he is so employed at the date on which under the provisions of this Article the period during which he is deemed to continue to be insured was due to terminate, in which case, he shall continue to be so deemed until the 30th day of June or the 31st day of December whichever next follows; or

(ii) he had been so employed for not less than eight weeks during the period consisting of the contribution half-year in which he so ceased to be employed and the contribution half-year immediately preceding, in which case he shall be deemed to continue to be insured in accordance with the provisions of this Article as if he had not previously been unemployed.

For the purposes of this Article a person who is employed at any time in a contribution week shall be treated as having been employed throughout that week."

REGULATIONS, DATED 14th DECEMBER, 1933, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR, IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE, UNDER SECTION 33 OF THE WIDOWS', ORPHANS' AND OLD AGE CONTRIBUTORY PENSIONS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1925.

The Ministry of Labour, in conjunction with the Ministry of Finance, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 33 of the Widows', Orphans' and Old Age Contributory Pensions Act (Northern Ireland), 1925, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby make the following Regulations:—

- 1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Contributory Pensions (Great Britain Reciprocal Arrangements) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1933, and shall be deemed to have had effect as from and after the 1st January, 1932.
- (2) Words and expressions in these Regulations shall have the same meaning as in the Memorandum of Arrangements set out in the Schedule to these Regulations.
