THE BUTTER AND MARGARINE (SALES) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1934, DATED THE 21ST DECEMBER, 1934, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE FOR NORTHERN IRELAND, AMENDING THE BUTTER AND MAR-GARINE (SALES) REGULATIONS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1934.

1934. No. 121.

WHEREAS, in pursuance of the provisions of Sub-Section (1) of Section Nine of the Milk and Milk Products Act (Northern Ireland), 1934, the Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland made regulations entitled the Butter and Margarine (Sales) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1934 (hereinafter referred to as the "principal Regulations"):

And whereas it appears expedient to the said Ministry that the principal Regulations should be amended in the manner hereinafter appearing :

Now, therefore, the Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers vested in it by Sub-Section (1) of Section Nine of the Milk and Milk Products Act (Northern Ireland), 1934, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations, that is to say :---

1. Article 3 of the principal Regulations shall be read and have effect as if there were added thereto the following proviso :—

Provided that nothing in this Article shall be deemed to relieve a licence-holder of the duty of paying the additional sum payable in respect of licence fee under Sub-Section (6) of Section 4 of the Act, upon butter or margarine sold to a person other than a person holding a licence under the said Section.

2. Article 7 of the principal Regulations shall be read and have effect as if there were added thereto the following Sub-Article :---

(2) Where a licence holder sells butter or margarine for manufacturing purposes, he shall keep a record in respect of each day, showing—

- (i) the names and addresses of persons by whom butter or margarine sold to them for manufacturing purposes was returned to him, and the quantity returned by each;
- (ii) the names and addresses of persons to whom he sold butter or margarine for manufacturing purposes, and the quantity so sold to each.

3. Article 8 of the principal Regulations shall be amended as follows :---

In line 10, after the word "holder" the following words shall be inserted :---

"except in the case of butter or margarine sold for manufacturing purposes, in which case the licence fee payable shall be calculated at the rate of one penny on every complete hundredweight sold to a person other than a licence-holder."

4. These Regulations may be cited as the Butter and Margarine (Sales) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1934, and shall be construed as one with the principal Regulations.

ORDER, DATED THE 5TH DAY OF DECEMBER, 1934, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE UNDER SECTION 14 OF THE MILK AND MILK PRODUCTS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1934.

WHEREAS by Section Fourteen of the Milk and Milk Products Act (Northern Ireland), 1934, (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is provided that the provisions of the Act with respect to the sale of milk according to grades of quality, and with respect to the sale of milk, butter and margarine under and in accordance with licences issued in pursuance of this Act, shall come into operation on such day as may be appointed by the Minister of Agriculture, and that before that day public notice of those provisions shall be given in such manner as the said Minister may direct :

Now, therefore, I, The Right Honourable Sir Basil Stanlake Brooke, Bart., the Minister of Agriculture for Northern Ireland, hereby order and direct as follows :---

1. The provisions of the Act in respect to the sale of milk according to grades of quality, and with respect to the sale of milk under and in accordance with licences issued in pursuance of the Act, shall come into force on the 16th day of December, 1934.
