

(Northern Ireland) Order, 1934, providing for the grading of dead pigs for curing into bacon and hams in Northern Ireland as from the first day of December, 1934.

Now the Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section 3 (1) (b) of the Agricultural Marketing (Pig Industry) Act (Northern Ireland), 1934, hereby makes the following Order :—

1. There shall be payable by each licensed curer in addition to the sum of ten pounds or five pounds payable upon the granting or renewal of his licence a sum calculated at the rate of one penny for each carcase graded in accordance with the aforesaid Pigs Marketing (Grading) Order, and such additional sum shall be payable to the Ministry monthly on demand and at the same time as the inspection fees payable under the Agricultural Produce (Meat Regulation) Act (Northern Ireland), 1930.

2. This Order may be cited as the Pigs Marketing (Grading Fee) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1934.

Pigs, Marketing of : Pig Industry : Appointed Day.

ORDER, DATED THE 24TH DAY OF DECEMBER, 1934, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE UNDER SECTION 16 OF THE AGRICULTURAL MARKETING (PIG INDUSTRY) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1934.

WHEREAS by Section Sixteen of the Agricultural Marketing (Pig Industry) Act (Northern Ireland), 1934 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is provided that except as is otherwise expressly provided in the Act, the Act shall come into operation on the appointed day and the appointed day for the purposes of the Act shall be such day as the Minister of Agriculture may appoint, and different days may be appointed for different purposes and different provisions of the Act.

Now, therefore, I, The Right Honourable Sir Basil Stanlake Brooke, Bart., the Minister of Agriculture for Northern Ireland, hereby order and direct as follows :—

With the exception of Section Five of the Act the provisions of the Act shall come into operation on the first day of January, nineteen hundred and thirty-five.
