THE MILK (GRADE A) REGULATIONS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1934, DATED 24TH AUGUST, 1934, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE (NORTHERN IRELAND), UNDER SECTION NINE OF THE MILK AND MILK PRODUCTS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1934 (24 AND 25 GEO. V. CH. 16).

1934. No. 69.

The Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section nine of the Milk and Milk Products Act (Northern Ireland), 1934, and of any other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations, that is to say:

PART I.

Short Title and Interpretation.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Milk (Grade A) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1934.

2.—(1) In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—

"The Ministry" means the Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland;

"The Act" means the Milk and Milk Products Act (Northern Ireland), 1934;

"Producer's licence" means a licence for the production and sale of milk of Grade A granted in accordance with Section two of the Act, and "producer" means the holder of such a licence;

"Distributor's licence" means a licence for the purchase and re-sale of milk of Grade A granted in accordance with Section two of the Act, and "distributor" means the holder of such a licence;

"Milch cow" means a cow kept for milking purposes ;

"Herd" means the milch cows in respect of which a Producer's licence has been granted, and includes any other bovine animal for the time being kept in contact with such milch cows while they are in milk;

Other expressions have the meanings respectively assigned to them in the Act.

2. The Interpretation Act, 1889 (a), as applied to Northern Ireland by the Interpretation Act, 1921 (b), shall apply for the purpose of the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies for the purpose of the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

PART II.

Quality of Milk of Grade A.

3. For the purpose of sub-section (2) of Section one of the Act, the prescribed double intradermal tuberculin test shall be a double intradermal tuberculin test carried out by an authorised officer, in such manner as the Ministry may from time to time approve, and the standards with which the bacteriological count, and the absence of bacillus coli of milk of Grade A must respectively comply, shall be as follows :--

- (a) the milk shall not contain more than 100,000 bacteria per cubic centimetre ;
- (b) no bacillus coli shall be found in one-hundredth part of a cubic centimetre.

PART III.

Conditions to be complied with by a Producer.

4. A producer shall not produce milk of Grade D upon the premises in respect of which a Producer's licence has been granted to him.

5. A producer shall isolate the herd from all other cattle.

6. A producer shall adopt a suitable system for the marking, for purposes of identification, of the animals of the herd, and he shall keep a register of such animals.

7. When a producer adds an animal to, or withdraws an animal from his herd, he shall within three days notify the Ministry of such addition or withdrawal, and in the case of a withdrawal he shall notify the Ministry of the reason therefor.

8. A producer shall permit any authorised officer, at any reasonable time and on production of his authority, to inspect

the herd and to submit any animals therein to such tests as such officer may deem necessary, and he shall also permit the officer in such circumstances to examine the register of animals in the herd and all premises, receptacles and equipment used by the producer in connexion with the production or sale of milk.

9. An authorised officer making an inspection of a herd may require any animal to be milked in his presence and may take samples of the milk and may require that the milk from any particular teat shall be kept separate, and he may take separate samples thereof.

10. A producer shall not permit any animal in the herd to be injected with tuberculin, except with the permission of the Ministry.

11. The Ministry, or any authorised officer, may direct a producer to remove any animal from his premises; on the ground that such animal shows evidence of disease which is likely to affect the milk injuriously, and the producer shall comply with such direction forthwith.

12. A producer shall take such measures as may be necessary in order to ensure that the milk from the herd shall, while under his control, be kept separate from all other milk.

13. A producer shall not at any stage treat the milk from the herd by heat or submit it to any process other than cooling.

14.—(1) A producer shall cool the milk from the herd immediately after production, and (except where the special authority of the Ministry has been obtained for the milk to be transferred to churns or cartons) shall, on the premises, transfer it to sterilised bottles.

(2) Where the special authority of the Ministry, as aforesaid, has been obtained, the producer shall, on the premises, transfer the milk from the herd to :

- (a) unventilated, sterilised churns of a capacity of not less than two gallons, and of a type which has been approved by the Ministry; or
- (b) sterilised cartons of a type which has also been so approved.

(3) Each bottle and churn shall be sterilised by steam on the premises.

(4) Each bottle shall be closed with a suitable cap overlapping the lip of the bottle and so fastened as to form a complete seal, provided that where the bottle is of a capacity of less than half a pint, it may be closed with a tightly-fitting disc. The cap or disc shall be green in colour and shall bear, embossed thereon or inscribed in white letters, the name and address of the producer or of the premises where the milk is produced, the day of production, and the words "Grade A Milk," the letter "A" being at least half an inch in height, but no other words shall be embossed or inscribed upon the cap or disc. There may, in addition, be embossed upon the bottle, or inscribed thereon in green letters

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any of the particulars which under this regulation are required to be embossed or inscribed upon the cap or disc but no other words relating to the quality of the milk may be added.

Every churn to which milk is transferred in accordance with this regulation shall be sealed and labelled in a suitable manner with the name and address of the producer or of the premises where the milk is produced, the day of production (with the words "morning" or "evening" according to the time of milking), and the words "Grade A." The label shall be green in colour and the churn shall bear upon the neck the words "Grade A" inscribed in green letters at least four inches in height, but no other words relating to the quality of the milk may be added.

Every carton to which milk is transferred under this regulation shall be sealed forthwith. The carton shall be white or cream in colour, and shall bear, in green letters, the name and address of the producer or of the premises where the milk is produced, the day of production and the words "Grade A Milk," but no other words relating to the quality of the milk may be added.

(5) Where under these Regulations it is required that the day of production shall be shown on any disc or cap or on any carton it shall be sufficient compliance with this requirement if milk produced after 4 p.m. on any day for sale on the following day is marked with the day of such sale.

(6) The milk shall not be removed from the bottles, churns or cartons, or the seals broken, before delivery to the consumer, to the holder of a Distributor's licence, or to a creamery.

15. A person who is the holder of licences in respect of the production and sale of milk of Grade A, and of milk of Grade B or Grade C, shall not, in any notice or advertisement upon any vehicle or at any premises used in connexion with the sale of such milk, insert any reference to milk of Grade A, unless he includes also a reference to milk of Grade B or Grade C in letters not less conspicuous and of approximately equal size.

16.—(1) Every producer shall keep a record in respect of each day showing :—

- (a) the names and addresses of the persons to whom milk from the herd was on that day sold or delivered otherwise than to a creamery for the purpose of the extraction of cream for sale as such or for manufacture into butter :]
- (b) the quantity of milk so sold or delivered to each person; and

(c) the price or prices at which the milk was sold.

Such record shall distinguish the holders of Distributors' licences from other persons to whom milk was sold.

(2) Every producer shall also keep a record in respect of each day showing :----

(a) the names of the creameries (if any) to which milk from the herd was on that day sold or delivered for the

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purpose of the extraction of cream for sale as such or

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- (b) the number of gallons so sold or delivered to each
 - creamery; and (c) the price or prices at which the milk was sold.

17. Every producer shall furnish to the Ministry, not later than the <u>fourteenth</u> day of each month, a return, in the form prescribed for the purpose(a), of his sales of milk from the herd during the preceding month, and of the number of milch cows in the herd on the date upon which the return is made. He shall, at the same time, transmit to the Ministry a Producer's licence fee payable in pursuance of sub-section (5) of Section two of the Act and calculated at the rate of one tenth of a penny per gallon upon all milk sold or delivered otherwise than to the holder of a Distributor's licence or to a creamery for the purpose of the extraction of cream for sale as such or for manufacture into butter.

PART IV.

Conditions to be complied with by a Distributor.

18. A distributor shall take such measures as may be necessary in order to ensure that the milk for the purchase and re-sale of which his Distributor's licence has been granted (hereinafter in this Part of these Regulations referred to as "the milk") shall be kept separate from all other milk.

19. A distributor shall not at any stage treat the milk by heat or submit it to any process other than cooling.

20.—(1) Except where the special authority of the Ministry has been obtained for the milk to be bottled by the distributor or transferred by him to churns or cartons the distributor shall deliver the milk to the purchaser in the bottles, churns or cartons in which it was received by him.

(2) Where the special authority of the Ministry, as aforesaid, has been obtained, the distributor shall immediately upon delivery of the milk to him cool it to a temperature of not more than 60° Fahrenheit, and, in accordance with the terms attached to the Ministry's authority, transfer it to:

- (a) sterilised bottles; or
- (b) unventilated sterilised churns of a capacity of not less than two gallons, and of a type which has been approved by the Ministry; or
- (c) sterilised cartons of a type which has also been so approved.

Each such bottle and churn shall be sterilised by steam on the premises.

(3) Where the milk is bottled, each bottle shall be closed with a suitable cap overlapping the lip of the bottle and so fastened as to form a complete seal, provided that where the bottle is of a capacity of less than half a pint it may be closed with a tightly

The cap or disc shall be green in colour, and shall bear, embossed thereon or inscribed in white letters, the name and address of the distributor or of the premises where the milk is bottled, the day of production and the words "Grade A Milk," the letter "A" being at least half an inch in height, but no other words shall be embossed or inscribed upon the disc or cap. There may, in addition, be embossed upon the bottle or inscribed thereon in green letters any of the particulars which under this regulation are required to be embossed or inscribed upon the cap or disc, but no other words relating to the quality of the milk may be added.

Every churn to which milk is transferred in accordance with this regulation, shall be sealed and labelled in a suitable manner with the name and address of the distributor or of the premises where the milk is transferred to the churn, the day of production (with the words "morning" or "evening" according to the time of milking"), and the words "Grade A." The label shall be green in colour and the churn shall also bear upon the neck the words "Grade A." inscribed in green letters at least four inches in height, but no other words relating to the quality of the milk.

Every carton to which milk is transferred under this regulation shall be sealed forthwith. The carton shall be white or cream in colour, and shall bear, in green letters, the name and address of the distributor or of the premises where the milk is transferred to the carton, the day of production and the words "Grade A Milk," but no other words relating to the quality of the milk may be added.

(4) The milk shall not be removed from the bottles, churns or cartons, or the seals broken, before delivery to the purchaser.

21. A person who is the holder of licences in respect of the purchase and re-sale of milk of Grade A and of milk of Grade B or Grade C shall not, in any notice or advertisement upon any vehicle or at any premises used in connexion with the sale of such milk, insert any reference to milk of Grade A, unless he includes also a reference to milk of Grade B or Grade C, in letters not less conspicuous and of approximately equal size.

22. Every distributor shall keep records in respect of each day showing :

- (a) the names and addresses of the producers and distributors from whom he purchased milk of Grade A on that day;
- (b) the number of gallons so purchased from each producer;
- (c) the number of gallons so purchased from each distributor;
- (d) the price or prices at which the milk was purchased;
- (e) the names and addresses of persons to whom the milk was on that day sold or delivered;

the quantity of the milk sold to each person; and (f)

(g) the price or prices at which the milk was sold.

23. Every distributor shall furnish to the Ministry, not later than the fourteenth day of each month, a return, in the form prescribed for the purpose(a), of his purchases and sales of milk of Grade A during the preceding month and shall, at the same time, transmit to the Ministry a sum payable in pursuance of subsection (5) of Section two of the Act in respect of Producers' the licence fees, and equal to one tenth of a penny for each gallon of 1935 milk of Grade A purchased from a producer, the amount of such fees having been duly deducted from the price payable by him to such producer.

Payment of Bonus under Section Eleven of the Act upon milk of Grade A delivered to creameries.

24.—(1) The bonus payable out of the Milk Fund in pursuance of paragraph (b) of sub-section (3) of Section eleven of the Act shall, in respect of milk of Grade A delivered to a creamery by the holder of a Producer's licence and used for the purpose of the extraction of cream for sale as such or for manufacture into butter, be two pence per gallon.

(2) A producer shall, not later than the fourteenth day of each month, make a return to the Ministry, in the form prescribed for the purpose(b), of any deliveries of milk of Grade A made by him to a creamery during the preceding month in respect of which he claims to be entitled to receive the bonus payable in accordance with this Part of these Regulations.

PART VI.

General.

25. The forms set forth in the Schedule hereto, or forms to the like effect, shall be used in the cases to which they are expressed to be applicable, and shall, for the purposes of the Act and of these Regulations, be deemed to be the prescribed forms.

26. Every applicant for a Producer's or a Distributor's licence, or for the renewal of such a licence, shall make application to the Ministry in the prescribed form(c), and such application shall be accompanied by a fee of two shillings and sixpence in the case of an application for a Producer's licence or for the renewal thereof, and of one pound in the case of an application for a Distributor's licence or for the renewal thereof.

Every application for a Producer's licence shall be accompanied by a certificate from a qualified veterinary surgeon to the effect that the herd has passed the double intradermal tuberculin test.

27.—(1) The Ministry shall, before granting a Producer's or a Distributor's licence to any applicant, satisfy itself that the

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applicant's arrangements for dealing with milk are such as will enable him to comply with the provisions of the Act and of these Regulations relating to the grade of milk in respect of which he is an applicant for a licence.

For the purpose of this regulation, the expression "arrangements for dealing with milk" shall, in relation to a licence for the production and sale of milk, or to an application for such a licence, mean arrangements for the production, handling, storage, treatment and distribution of milk, and shall, in relation to a licence for the purchase and re-sale of milk, or to an application for such a licence, mean arrangements for the handling, storage, treatment and distribution of milk.

(2) In determining whether an applicant's arrangements are such as will enable him to comply with the conditions upon which the licence applied for may be granted, the Ministry shall have regard *inter alia* to the nature of the receptacles in which the applicant proposes to deliver the milk to purchasers, and the suitability of his arrangements for the sterilisation of such receptacles.

28. The Ministry shall not, save in exceptional circumstances and subject to such special conditions as it may impose, grant a Producer's licence to any person in respect of any premises, if that person holds a licence for the production and sale of milk of Grade B or Grade C in respect of those premises.

29. Before suspending or revoking a Producer's licence or a Distributor's licence, the Ministry shall serve on the holder a notice stating the grounds upon which it is proposed to suspend or revoke the licence, and shall afford him a reasonable opportunity of making such representations to the Ministry in regard thereto as he may think fit.
