

Inconsiderable Employments.

THE UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE (INCONSIDERABLE EMPLOYMENTS) (PERSONS UNDER SIXTEEN) REGULATIONS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1934, DATED 30TH AUGUST, 1934, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER SECTION 2 OF THE UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1934.

The Ministry of Labour (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") by virtue of the powers conferred by Section 2 of the Unemployment Insurance Act (Northern Ireland), 1934, and of all other powers in that behalf hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1. There shall be added to the excepted employments the classes of employment specified in the first column of the Schedule hereto only as respects the persons and to the extent specified in the second column of the said Schedule.

2. In these Regulations the expression "persons under sixteen" means persons between the age (not being less than 14 years) at which under the law for the time being in force their parents cease to be under an obligation to cause them to attend school unless there is some reasonable excuse and the age of 16 years.

3.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Unemployment Insurance (Inconsiderable Employments) (Persons under Sixteen) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1934, and shall come into force on the 3rd day of September, 1934.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1921, applies to the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

SCHEDULE.

Class of Employment.	Persons affected and Extent.
Insurable employment in a retail distributive trade.	Persons under sixteen who are employed by or under one or by or under more than one employer where the employment by or under no one of such employers exceeds in the aggregate eight hours in any week or four hours on any day.
