

“Inspector” means an Inspector or other authorised officer of the Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland.

“Importer” includes any person who, whether as owner, consignor or consignee, agent or broker, is in possession of, or in any wise entitled to the custody or control of the article.

“Plant” includes living plants and parts thereof except seeds.

Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the Importation of Plants (Northern Ireland) (Amendment) Order of 1935, and the Importation of Plants Order (Northern Ireland) of 1933, the Importation of Plants (Northern Ireland) (Amendment) Order of 1934, and this Order may be cited together as the Importation of Plants (Northern Ireland) Orders of 1933 to 1935.

REGULATIONS DATED 2ND DECEMBER, 1935, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION, NORTHERN IRELAND, UNDER SECTION 4 OF THE EDUCATION (ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1935, AND DULY LAID BEFORE PARLIAMENT.

1935. No. 144.

1. From and after the date of these Regulations none of the officers hereinafter in this Article specified shall be appointed by an Education Authority, nor shall any officer so appointed be

removed from office by an Education Authority, without the concurrence of the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland (hereinafter called "The Ministry"), that is to say :—

- (i) The chief officer, by whatever name or title designated, of any Education Committee or Regional Education Committee, or Committee appointed by an Urban District Council under Section 23 of the Education Act (Northern Ireland), 1923 ; whether he is employed in a part-time or full-time capacity ;
- (ii) Any other officer of such committee whose remuneration is at the rate of £300 per annum or more or who is placed on a scale of salary the maximum of which is at the rate of £300 per annum or more ;

Provided, however, that the foregoing provisions of this Article shall not apply to the following officers of an Education Authority, namely—

- (a) To part-time officers except as provided in (1) above ;
- (b) To teachers whose appointment, removal and conditions of service are the subject of other rules and regulations ;
- (c) To medical officers, dentists, nurses or other persons professionally employed under or in connection with a scheme of medical service, the appointments and conditions of employment of such officers being subject to the control and approval of the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland.

And provided always that the foregoing provisions of this Article shall be without prejudice to the provisions of any other rules and regulations duly made and from time to time in force.

2. The said concurrence to the appointment and removal of every officer as hereinbefore specified shall be signified by the Ministry in writing.

3. All officers to whom these regulations apply shall be appointed under a written contract which shall specify the terms of their employment and the nature of their duties.

4. In any case of doubt or difficulty as to the interpretation of these regulations the decision of the Ministry shall be final.

5. These Regulations may be cited as the Regulations respecting the Appointment and Dismissal of Officers of Education Authorities, Northern Ireland, 1935.
