

- (ii) if shipped to Northern Ireland from a Port other than a Port in the country of origin, provided that evidence is produced to the satisfaction of the Director of the Government Wool Disinfecting Station or other person authorised by the Minister of Home Affairs for the purpose as to the origin of the material.

This exception shall only apply if the mohair is imported in unbroken bales as originally shipped from the country of origin.

4. The Order in Council of 9th March, 1921, regulating the importation of goat hair from India and of wool and animal hair from Egypt is hereby revoked in so far as it applies to the importation of goat hair into Northern Ireland.

5. This Order shall take effect as from the 22nd day of April, 1935.

CENSUS OF PRODUCTION.

Rules.

THE CENSUS OF PRODUCTION RULES, 1935, DATED DECEMBER 23RD, 1935, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE UNDER SECTIONS 3 AND 8 OF THE CENSUS OF PRODUCTION ACT, 1906 (6 EDW. 7, CH. 49).

1935. No. 152.

WHEREAS it is provided by Section 3, sub-section (1) of the Census of Production Act, 1906 (6 Edw. 7, Ch. 49) that forms shall be prepared for the purpose of being filled up by the persons specified in the Schedule to the said Act with such of the particulars set out in the said sub-section as may be prescribed.

And whereas, by Section 8 of the said Act as adapted and applied pursuant to the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, by the Directions of the Lord Lieutenant, dated 7th June, 1921, and the General Adaptation of Enactments (Northern Ireland) Order, 1921, it is provided that the Ministry of Commerce for Northern Ireland may make Rules thereunder:—

- (a) For prescribing, either generally or as respects any particular industry or class of industries, anything which, under the Act, is to be prescribed; and

(b) for exempting from the obligation to make returns under the Act, either wholly or to the prescribed extent, and either unconditionally or subject to the prescribed conditions, any persons or any prescribed classes of persons ; and

(c) generally for carrying the Act into effect.

And whereas by the Census of Production (1936) Order (Northern Ireland), 1934,^(a) it was ordered that a Census of Production should be taken in the year 1936 in respect of production in the year 1935 (hereinafter referred to as "the Census").

And whereas the Board of Trade have published in the Belfast Gazette notice that they will require returns in relation to the year 1935 to be delivered to them in accordance with the provisions of Section 9 of the Import Duties Act, 1932 (22 Geo. 5, Ch. 8) in respect of the manufacture in the United Kingdom of goods of any class or description which, if they were imported into the United Kingdom, would be chargeable with a duty of Customs under any of the following enactments, viz :—

The Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921 ;
 The Finance Act, 1925, Section 3 ;
 The Import Duties Act, 1932—Part I ;
 The Finance Act, 1933, Section 9.

(hereinafter referred to as "dutiabale goods").

And whereas, by arrangement with the Board of Trade, the Ministry of Commerce is responsible for the collection and aggregation of the returns in relation to the year 1935 required to be delivered in accordance with the provisions of Section 9 of the Import Duties Act, 1932, aforesaid, in respect of factories and workshops in Northern Ireland.

Now, therefore, the Ministry of Commerce, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon the said Ministry by Section 8 of the Census of Production Act, 1906, hereby make the following Rules (that is to say) :—

1. These Rules may be cited as the Census of Production Rules (Northern Ireland), 1935.

2. Except as hereinafter provided the particulars to be supplied by the persons mentioned in the Schedule to the Census of Production Act, 1906, in respect of the Census shall be the particulars indicated in such one or more of the forms specified in the First Schedule hereto as may be appropriate to the trade or business of such persons, provided that any such person who has employed on an average during the year 1935 less than ten persons in connection with the trades or industries to which the said forms relate shall only be required to give the particulars set out in Parts "A" and "B" of the declaration contained in the said forms.

3. Every person who shall have filled up and delivered to the Ministry of Commerce acting on behalf of the Board of Trade a form of return in respect of the year 1935 pursuant to Section 9 of the Import Duties Act, 1932, and who shall have consented in writing to the form of return so delivered being used by the Ministry of Commerce for the purposes of the Census shall be exempt from the obligation to make returns under the Census of Production Act, 1906, except in respect of goods manufactured by him not being dutiable goods.

4. Forms issued by the Ministry of Commerce on 1st January, 1936, shall, after being duly filled up and signed, be delivered, either by hand or through the post, to the Census of Production Office, situate at Chichester Street, Belfast, on or before the first day of April, 1936. Forms issued by the Ministry of Commerce after the 1st day of January, 1936, shall, after being duly filled up and signed, be delivered either by hand or through the post to the said Census of Production Office on or before a date not later than three months after the date on which any such form was issued.

5. These Rules shall not apply to—

- (a) any person in respect of the trades or industries set out in the Second Schedule hereto
- (b) Boards of Guardians.
