And I hereby further order and appoint that the dates on which the enactments indicated in the first columns of Schedules A and B above shall come into operation shall not apply as respects appeals against any valuations contained in the revised Valuation Lists to be issued by the Commissioner of Valuation on the first day of March, 1935.

REGULATIONS DATED THE 26TH DAY OF JANUARY, 1935, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE UNDER SECTIONS 1, 9 AND 15 OF THE VALUATION ACTS AMENDMENT ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1932.

1935. No. 20.

The Ministry of Finance in exercise of the powers conferred upon the said Ministry by Sections 1, 9 and 15 of the Valuation Acts Amendment Act (Northern Ireland), 1932, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

Short Title and Interpretation.

- 1.—(1) These regulations may be cited as the General Revaluation Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1935.
- (2) In these regulations the following expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say:—
 - "The Act of 1852," "the Act of 1854" and "the Act of 1932" mean, respectively, the Valuation (Ireland) Act, 1852, the Valuation (Ireland) Act, 1854, and the Valuation Acts Amendment Act (Northern Ireland), 1932;
 - "The Adaptation Order of 1899" means the Local Government (Adaptation of Irish Enactments Order), 1899;
 - "Urban district" and "urban district council" include, respectively, a county borough or other borough and the council of any such borough, and "clerk" includes the town clerk of a borough;
 - "The Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Valuation;

Other expressions have the same meaning as in the Valuation Acts (Northern Ireland), 1852 to 1932.

- 2. The fourth day of March, 1935, is hereby prescribed as the day on which the first general revaluation shall be issued by the Commissioner.
- 3.—(1) The Commissioner shall, within fourteen days from and after the fourth day of March, 1935, send to the occupier or immediate lessor of every hereditament which has been revalued, or to any person acting as agent for the occupier or immediate lessor of such a hereditament, a notice in the form shown in Schedule A hereto, or in a form substantially to the like effect.
- (2) The Commissioner may, if he thinks fit, in the case of notices to be sent to immediate lessors or agents, send one notice only in respect of two or more hereditaments of which the same person is the immediate lessor or agent and may, in such case, set out the required particulars of the hereditaments to which the notice relates in a schedule attached to the notice.

Method of issuing General Revaluations.

- 4—(1) In issuing a general revaluation the Commissioner shall proceed in the manner specified in section 17 of the Act of 1852, and shall, when he transmits the copies of the revaluation list relating to any urban district (not being a county borough) to the urban district council, transmit also to the council of the county in which the urban district is situate a statement of the total of the valuation of the said district.
- (2) The Commissioner, when he transmits the copies of the revaluation list to any county council, shall send also for each rural district within the county a copy of so much of the list as

relates to hereditaments situated in the district, and the secretary of the county council shall forthwith, after receiving the said copy, transmit it to the clerk of the rural district council.

5. Public notice before the issue of a general revaluation shall be given by the Commissioner and after issue by the secretaries of county councils, clerks of urban district councils and clerks of rural district councils in the manner prescribed by regulation 8 of these regulations.

6. As soon as may be after the issue of a general revaluation the Commissioner shall deposit a complete set of the lists containing such general revaluation in the Public Record Office of Northern Ireland at Belfast.

Deposit of a complete set of General Revaluation Lists.

7. As respects the county boroughs of Belfast and Londonderry a notice of appeal under section 19 of the Act of 1852, as amended by section 9 of the Act of 1932, relating to a hereditament contained in the first general revaluation list may be sent or delivered to the town clerk of the county borough in which the hereditament is situated within ninety days from and after the receipt of the list by such town clerk.

Extension of Appeal Period for County Boroughs of Belfast and Londonderry.

8.—(1) The Lists containing a general revaluation shall be left open for public inspection at the offices of the county council or at the offices of the urban district council, as the case may be, in the manner specified in section 18 of the Act of 1852, and, as respects hereditaments situated in a rural district, the copy of the portion of the lists transmitted by the secretary of the county council to the clerk of the rural district council in pursuance of regulation 4 (2) of these regulations shall be left open for public inspection at the offices of the rural district council.

Publication of Revaluation Lists and Notices.

- (2) The list of notices of appeal to quarter sessions required under section 22 of the Act of 1852 shall be left open for public inspection at the offices of the county council or at the offices of the urban district council, as the case may be, in the manner specified in the said section.
- (3) The Commissioner shall, at any time within ten days before the day on which a general revaluation is to be issued, cause to be inserted in one or more newspapers circulating in Northern Ireland a notice in the form headed "Form I" in Schedule B hereto.
- (4) The clerk of an urban district council shall, within three days after the receipt of a general revaluation list, cause a notice or notices in the form headed "Form II" in Schedule B hereto to be published by affixing such notice or notices in some public or conspicuous place or situation in the urban district and by publishing such notice in one or more newspapers circulating in

the district. The secretary of a county council shall, in like manner and within the same period, cause to be published in the county a notice or notices in the form headed "Form III" in Schedule B hereto, and shall also within the same period transmit to the clerk of each rural district within the county a sufficient number of copies of notice of publication in the form headed "Form IV" in Schedule B hereto.

- (5) The clerk of a rural district council shall forthwith after the receipt of the notices referred to in the preceding paragraph cause one or more of such notices to be affixed in some public or conspicuous place or situation in the district.
- (6) Paragraphs (1), (3), (4) and (5) of this regulation shall apply with the necessary modifications to the appeal list relating to a general revaluation, that is to say, the list transmitted by the Commissioner in pursuance of section 21 of the Act of 1852.

Sir or Madam,

I have to inform you that, in pursuance of the provisions of the Valuation Acts Amendment Act (Northern Ireland), 1932, the hereditament indicated above has been revalued and that the valuation thereof has been entered in the First General Revaluation List which has been issued to the Secretary, Antrim County Council, County Court House, Crumlin Road, Belfast. This List, which will not, however, come into force until 1st April, 1936, is now open for public inspection at that address, while a copy of that portion of the List which relates to the Rural District in which the hereditament is situated may also be inspected at the offices of the Rural District Council, Antrim, Co. Antrim.

I should explain that all reasonable care has been taken to ensure that the particulars set out above are identical with those contained in the Revaluation List, but I should point out that, in the event of any discrepancy, the List is the binding document.

With the exception of agricultural land, agricultural buildings and railway hereditaments, the basis of valuation of each hereditament is that prescribed by Section 11 of the Valuation (Ireland) Act, 1852, namely: "the rent for which, one year with another, the same might in its actual state be reasonably expected to let from year to year, the probable average annual cost of repairs, insurance, and other expenses (if any) necessary to maintain the hereditament in its actual state, and all rates, taxes, and public charges, if any, (except tithe rentcharge,) being paid by the tenant."

The valuations of agricultural land, agricultural buildings and railway hereditaments are, with the exception of a comparatively small number of cases, entered in the Revaluation List at the amounts appearing in the current Valuation List.

Your attention is directed to the notes overleaf which explain the circumstances in which an appeal against the valuation may be made, and the procedure which must be followed.

Appeals to the Commissioner of Valuation.

(1) Any person aggrieved by reason of the valuation of any rateable hereditament, or by reason of any inaccurate statement of area or inaccurate description of any rateable hereditament, contained in the First General Revaluation List for any County, or any other cause whatsoever, may send or deliver to the Secretary of the County Council, a Notice in Writing setting forth the grounds of such grievance.

(2) If the cause of appeal is such as to require alteration to be made in the valuation of any hereditament for which any person other than the appellant is liable to be rated, the appellant must send or deliver a copy of the Notice of Appeal to such other person and that person may, if he so desires, be heard upon the appeal.

- (3) An appeal cannot lie against any valuation of agricultural land or agricultural buildings, or against the valuation of any railway hereditement unless that valuation has been revised in the course of the last Annual Revision, or has been changed in pursuance of the provisions of the Valuation Acts Amendment Act (Northern Ireland), 1932.

 (4) For purposes of identification it is necessary that each Notice of Appeal
- shall state clearly :-
 - The Situation of the hereditament, including the map number where such forms part of the "Reference."
 The Valuation Office Number.

3. The Description of the Hereditament.
4. The Amount of the Valuation appealed against.
For the convenience of the public a Special Form of Notice of Appeal has been prepared, a Copy of which may be obtained at the Offices of the County Council or at the Offices of the Rural District Council.

(5) It is anticipated that the Commissioner's decisions on appeals will not be available until the latter part of 1935. Each appellant will, however, be notified of the decision on his appeal as soon as possible.
