Milk Regulations: Grade C.

THE MILK (GRADE C) REGULATIONS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1935-DATED 12TH FEBRUARY, 1935, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE (NORTHERN IRELAND), UNDER SECTION NINE OF THE MILK AND MILK PRODUCTS ACT (NORTHERN IRE-LAND), 1934, (24 AND 25 GEO. V, CH. 16).

1935. No. 25.

The Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section nine of the Milk and Milk Products Act (Northern Ireland), 1934, and of any other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations, that is to say:

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Milk (Grade C) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1935, and shall be construed as one with the Milk (Grade C) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1934 (A).

Short Title.

2. A distributor shall not buy milk of Grade D, otherwise than for the purpose of the extraction of cream for sale as such, or for manufacture into butter, at premises which have been registered by him as a central creamery or as an auxiliary creamery under Part I of the Marketing of Dairy Produce Act (Northern Ireland), 1929 (B), and which do not form part of, or communicate with, premises used by him in connection with his business as a distributor of milk.

Conditions to be complied with by a distributor.

- 3. A distributor shall not transfer milk to his own churns or cans from the churns or cans of a producer or another distributor, except at the premises specified in his licence or at the premises of the producer or distributor from whose churns or cans the milk is transferred.
