

## Importation of Elm Trees and Conifers.

THE IMPORTATION OF ELM TREES AND CONIFERS (PROHIBITION)  
(NORTHERN IRELAND) (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1935,  
DATED JULY 17, 1935.

The Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in it under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts (Northern Ireland) 1877 to 1934 (40 and 41 Vict., c. 68 and 7 Edw. 7, c. 4 and 24 and 25 Geo. 5), and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, orders and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

*Modification of the Importation of Elm Trees and Conifers  
(Prohibition) (Northern Ireland) Order of 1933.*

1. Plants of any of the genera mentioned in the Schedule to the Importation of Elm Trees and Conifers (Prohibition) (Northern Ireland) Order of 1933, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") may be landed in Northern Ireland notwithstanding any of the provisions of the principal Order, for instructional, scientific and similar purposes under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence issued by the Ministry or by an Inspector.

*Commencement.*

2. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of August, nineteen hundred and thirty-five.

*Short Title.*

3. This Order may be cited as the Importation of Elm Trees and Conifers (Prohibition) (Northern Ireland) (Amendment) Order of 1935, and shall be read as one with the principal Order, and the principal Order and this Order may be cited together as the Importation of Elm Trees and Conifers (Prohibition) (Northern Ireland) Orders of 1933 and 1935.
