- (3) of Section 3 of the above-mentioned statute, towards the expenses of a youthful offender who has been sent to the Reformatory School pursuant to an Order shall, from the first day of April, Nineteen hundred and thirty-six, and until varied by any subsequent Order, be at the rate of 13/– per week during such time as such youthful offender is detained in the Reformatory School.
- 2. Payment of the contribution as aforesaid shall be in arrear, and shall be made half-yearly by the Council of the County or County Borough in respect of the half-years ending 30th September and 31st March, respectively, and shall be made not later than two months from the date of the claim for payment.
- 3. The regulations made by the Ministry of Home Affairs and approved by the Ministry of Finance on the 23rd day of September, 1935, are hereby revoked.

THE MILK (EQUALISATION PAYMENTS) REGULATIONS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1936, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER SECTION NINE OF THE MILK AND MILK PRODUCTS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1934, (24 AND 25 GEO. 5, CH. 16).

1936. No. 104.

Whereas by sub-section (3) (a) of Section eleven of the Milk and Milk Products Act (Northern Ireland), 1934, (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") it is provided that there shall

be paid out of the Milk Fund a payment (in the Act referred to as "the equalisation payment") to be made in respect of all milk produced in Northern Ireland and delivered to a creamery and used for the purpose of the extraction of cream for sale as such or for manufacture into butter, and being of such amount as may be required to raise the average price paid by all creameries for such milk to the amount per gallon specified in sub-section (4) of the said section:

And whereas by sub-section (4) of the said section it is provided that the equalisation payment shall be paid at such times and in such manner and subject to such conditions as may be prescribed, and shall be—

- (a) for the period beginning on the first day of April, nineteen hundred and thirty-four, and ending on the thirty-first day of March, nineteen hundred and thirtysix, such sum as will raise the average price of milk hereinbefore mentioned to five pence per gallon during the summer months and six pence per gallon during the winter months; and
- (b) after the said thirty-first day of March, such sum as may be prescribed from time to time, not being greater than is required to raise the average price of milk hereinbefore mentioned to five pence per gallon during the summer months and six pence per gallon during the winter months:

Now, therefore, the Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by Section nine of the Act, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations, that is to say:—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Milk (Equalisation Payments) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1936.
- 2. The Interpretation Act, 1889 (a), as applied to Northern Ireland by the Interpretation Act, 1921, (b), shall apply for the purpose of the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies for the purpose of the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 3. The equalisation payment to be made in respect of all milk produced in Northern Ireland and delivered during the period beginning on the first day of April, 1936, and ending on the thirtieth day of September, 1937, to a creamery and used for the purpose of the extraction of cream for sale as such or for manufacture into butter shall be of such sum as will raise the average price paid by all creameries for such milk to five pence

per gallon during the summer months and six pence per gallon during the winter months.

THE MILK (GRADE A) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1936, DATED 23RD DAY OF JUNE, 1936, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER SECTION NINE OF THE MILK AND MILK PRODUCTS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1934 (24 AND 25 GEO. V. CH. 16).

1936. No. 91.

The Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section nine of the Milk and Milk Products Act (Northern Ireland), 1934, and of any other powers enabling it on that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations, that is to say:—

- 1. For paragraph (4) of Article 14 of the Milk (Grade A) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1934(a) (hereinafter referred to as the "principal Regulations") the following shall be substituted:—
 - "(4) Each bottle shall be closed with a suitable cap overlapping the lip of the bottle and so fastened as to form a complete seal, provided that where the bottle is of a capacity of less than half a pint, it may be closed with a tightly fitting disc. The cap or disc shall be green in colour and shall bear, embossed thereon or inscribed in white letters, the name and address of the producer or of the premises where the milk is produced, the day of production, and the words 'Grade A Milk,' the letter 'A' being at least half an inch in height, but no other words shall be embossed or inscribed upon the cap or disc. There may, in addition, be embossed upon the bottle, or inscribed thereon in green letters any of the particulars which under this regulation are required to be embossed or inscribed upon the cap or disc, provided that
