Now, therefore, the Ministry, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by the said sub-section and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order, that is to say:—

- 1. The Board shall, during the period 6th April, 1936, to 2nd May, 1936, inclusive, for the purpose of meeting the said uncovered portion of the total loss impose a special levy of one shilling per pig upon all producers who are liable to pay a contribution under the provisions of Paragraph 40 of the Pigs Marketing Scheme (Northern Ireland), 1933, as approved by the Pigs Marketing Scheme (Northern Ireland) (Approval) Order, 1933, and as amended by the Pigs Marketing Scheme (Northern Ireland) (Amendment) Order, 1934, and by the Pigs Marketing Scheme (Northern Ireland) (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1934, or by any subsequent Order.
 - 2. This Order may be cited as the Pigs Marketing (Northern Ireland) (Special Levy) (No. 2) Order, 1936, and shall come into force on the 6th day of April, 1936.

Rules.

THE AGRICULTURAL PRODUCE (MEAT REGULATION) RULES (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1936, DATED 9TH DAY OF NOVEMBER, 1936.

1936. No. 145.

The Ministry of Agriculture by virtue and in exercise of the powers for this purpose vested in it by the Agricultural Produce (Meat Regulation) Act (Northern Ireland), 1930, and of every other power in that behalf enabling it, hereby makes the Rules following, that is to say:—

I. Short Title.

These Rules shall be known as the "Agricultural Produce (Meat Regulation) Rules (Northern Ireland), 1936."

II. Revocation.

The Agricultural Produce (Meat Regulation) Rules (Northern Ireland) No. 2 of 1934 are hereby revoked as on and from the date of the commencement of these Rules.

III. Amendment of Article IV. of the Agricultural Produce (Meat Regulation) Rules (Northern Ireland), 1931.

The following paragraph shall be substituted for paragraph (6) of Article IV of the Agricultural Produce (Meat Regulation) Rules (Northern Ireland), 1931:—

Where the carcase of a pig is bought by or on behalf of a licensed bacon curer the buyer may deduct from the price of the carcase the sum of four pence, so as to defray the expenses of the buyer, and to ensure the buyer against loss in the event of the carcase being subsequently certified as unfit for human consumption.

IV. Commencement.

These Rules shall come into operation on the 1st day of December, 1936.
