

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Contributory Pensions (Joint Committee) Regulations (Northern Ireland) (No. 2), 1936.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1921, applies to the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. The National Health Insurance Joint Committee alone shall exercise the powers of the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland to make regulations prescribing the period within which notice of any disease or disablement is to be given for the purposes of sub-section (1) of section 20 of the National Health Insurance and Contributory Pensions Act, 1935, as extended to Northern Ireland by the National Health Insurance and Contributory Pensions Act (Northern Ireland), 1935, and the National Health Insurance and Contributory Pensions (Enactments) Order (Northern Ireland), 1935.

Notification of Incapacity.

REGULATIONS, DATED 29TH DECEMBER, 1936, MADE BY THE NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE JOINT COMMITTEE UNDER SECTION 20 (1) OF THE NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE AND CONTRIBUTORY PENSIONS ACT, 1935 (25 & 26 GEO. 5, c. 44).

The National Health Insurance Joint Committee in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of section 20 of the National Health Insurance and Contributory Pensions Act, 1935, as extended to Northern Ireland by the National Health Insur-

ance and Contributory Pensions Act (Northern Ireland), 1935, and the National Health Insurance and Contributory Pensions (Enactments) Order (Northern Ireland), 1935, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby make the following Regulations :—

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Contributory Pensions (Notification of Incapacity) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1936.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1921, applies to the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. The prescribed period within which notice is required to be given of any disease or disablement for the purposes of sub-section (1) of section 20 of the National Health Insurance and Contributory Pensions Act, 1935, as applied to Northern Ireland, shall be the period ending on a date twelve months after the date on which the free insurance period specified in that sub-section expired :

Provided that the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland, if satisfied that there is in any particular case reasonable ground for so doing, may extend the period by a further period not exceeding six months.
