- (2) That the Licensee(s) shall not sell potatoes to importers in Great Britain or the Isle of Man at a price which is less than the minimum price determined for this purpose by the North of Ireland Potato Marketing Association and in operation at the time of such sale.
- (3) That the Licensee(s) shall comply with the provisions of the Acts and the Rules made thereunder and with such Rules and directions as the Ministry may from time to time issue.

## Immunisation against Diphtheria.

THE PUBLIC HEALTH (IMMUNISATION AGAINST DIPHTHERIA) REGULATIONS, 1936.

1936. No. 29.

To the Council of each County Borough, Borough, Urban or Rural District in Northern Ireland;
And to all whom it may concern:

Whereas it is enacted in effect by section 148 of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, that the Ministry of Home Affairs

may from time to time make, alter and revoke such regulations as to the said Ministry may seem fit, with a view to the treatment of persons affected with any epidemic, endemic or infectious disease and preventing the spread of such disease, and may declare by what authority such regulations shall be enforced and executed:

And whereas diphtheria is an infectious disease, and it is desirable that regulations should be made for the purpose of preventing the spread of such disease:

Now, therefore, the Ministry of Home Affairs in pursuance of the powers vested in the Ministry by section 148 of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, and all other powers in that behalf enabling the Ministry hereby makes the following regulations:—

- 1. A local authority may for the purpose of preventing the spread of diphtheria, being an infectious disease, provide facilities for the immunisation of persons against such disease and do all such other things as are incidental to the provision of such facilities.
- 2. A local authority may appoint one or more legally qualified medical practitioners and such other persons as it thinks fit to act in the execution of these regulations and may pay the practitioner or practitioners or other persons so appointed such remuneration for his or their services as may be approved by the Ministry.
- 3. Every medical practitioner appointed to act in the execution of these regulations should produce evidence of instruction or experience in the methods of diphtheria immunisation.
- 4.—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Public Health (Immunisation against Diphtheria) Regulations, 1936.
  - (2) In these regulations—
    - "the Ministry" means the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland;
    - "local authority" means a county borough, borough, urban or rural district council.
- (3) The Interpretation Act, 1889, as applied to Northern Ireland by the Interpretation Act, 1921, shall apply for the purpose of the interpretation of these regulations as it applies for the purpose of the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
