**Unlawful Associations.**

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF HOME AFFAIRS, DATED THE 8TH DAY OF APRIL, 1936, MADE UNDER THE CIVIL AUTHORITIES (SPECIAL POWERS) ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1922 AND 1933.

1936. No. 47.

WHEREAS certain Regulations for peace and order in Northern Ireland are contained in the Schedule to the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Act (Northern Ireland), 1922, and it is provided by Sub-section 3 of Section 1 of the said Act that the Minister of Home Affairs shall have power to make Regulations (a) for making further provision for the preservation of the peace and maintenance of order, and (b) for varying or revoking any provision of the Regulations, whether contained in the said Schedule or made as aforesaid, and that any Regulations made as aforesaid shall, subject to the provisions of this Act, have effect and be enforced in like manner as Regulations contained in the said Schedule :

Now, therefore, I, The Right Honourable Sir Richard Dawson Bates, Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, do make the following Regulation for making further provision for the preservation of the peace and maintenance of order, and the said Regulation shall have effect and be enforced in like manner as Regulations contained in the said Schedule, and the said Regulation now made and the Regulations contained in the said Schedule shall have effect and be construed as if the said Regulation now made formed part of the said Regulations in the said Schedule, that is to say :—

Regulation 24A. made pursuant to said Act shall be amended as follows :—

The following organisation shall be added to the list of organisations set out in Regulation 24A. which, for the purposes of that Regulation, shall be deemed to be unlawful Associations :

“ Cumann Poblachta na H-Eireann.”

### Exempt and Excepted Persons.

REGULATIONS, DATED 10TH NOVEMBER, 1936, MADE BY THE NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE JOINT COMMITTEE IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE UNDER THE WIDOWS', ORPHANS' AND OLD AGE CONTRIBUTORY PENSIONS ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1925 TO 1935.

The National Health Insurance Joint Committee in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Sub-section 2 of Section 14 of the Widows', Orphans' and Old Age Contributory Pensions Act (Northern Ireland), 1925, as amended by Section 12 of and

the Second Schedule to the National Health Insurance Act (Northern Ireland), 1930, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf and in conjunction with the Ministry of Finance, hereby make the following Regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Contributory Pensions (Exempt and Excepted Persons) Amendment Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1936, and shall be read as one with the Contributory Pensions (Exempt and Excepted Persons) Consolidated Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1932 (hereinafter referred to as the "Principal Regulations").

2. The following paragraph shall be added and shall be deemed always to have been added to Article 3 of the Principal Regulations :—

"A person, who on attaining the age of 65 is deemed to be an insured person by virtue of the provisions of Section 14 (2) of the Pensions Act, or is deemed to continue to be so insured by virtue of the foregoing provisions of this Article shall be deemed so to continue throughout his life."
