Classes of employment to be added to the excepted employments as respects persons employed therein, subject to the conditions and exceptions and to the extent in any week therein specified.

Classes of Employment.	Persons affected and extent.
<p>1. All classes of employment which, but for these Regulations, would be insurable employment. . .</p>	<p>1. (a) Persons of the age of 16 years or over, if and to the extent that they are employed in any week by or under any one employer for less than 4 hours in that week; and</p> <p>(b) Persons who have attained the minimum age for entry into insurance, if and to the extent that they are employed in any week by or under any one employer in employment which does not exceed in length a normal working day, where such employment occurs —</p> <p>(i) only on a Sunday in any week, and the person employed is also employed in insurable employment by or under the same employer on the Monday in the succeeding week, or</p> <p>(ii) only on a Monday in any week, and the person employed has also been employed in insurable employment by or under the same employer on the Sunday and on at least one other day in the preceding week.</p>
<p>2. Employment in clearing snow, which, but for these Regulations, would be insurable employment . . .</p>	<p>2. Persons of the age of 16 years or over if and to the extent that they are employed in any week by or under any one employer on not more than 4 days in that week.</p>

THE UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE (INCONSIDERABLE EMPLOYMENTS) AMENDMENT REGULATIONS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1936, DATED 28TH APRIL, 1936, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER SECTION 2 OF THE UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1934.

WHEREAS the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") has made the Unemployment Insurance (Inconsiderable Employments) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1936 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations"), and it is expedient to amend the said Regulations.

Now therefore the Ministry by virtue of the powers conferred by Section 2 of the Unemployment Insurance Act (Northern

Ireland), 1934, and of all other powers in that behalf hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Unemployment Insurance (Inconsiderable Employments) Amendment Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1936.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1921, applies to the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

(3) These Regulations shall come into force on the 4th day of May, 1936.

2. The principal Regulations shall have effect as if in paragraph 1 (a) of the Second Column of the Schedule thereto after the word "over" there were inserted the words "(other than persons employed in loading, unloading, moving or handling goods in, on, or at any dock, wharf or quay or in loading, unloading or coaling any ship in any dock, harbour or canal or in assisting in the navigating or mooring of vessels in or in the neighbourhood of any dock, harbour or canal if they are normally employed in any such employment)".

WHEREAS the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") by the Unemployment Insurance (Insurance Industry Special Scheme) Orders (Northern Ireland), 1921 to 1935, approved for the purposes of Section 18 of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920, a Special Scheme for the Insurance Industry and subsequently varied and amended the said Scheme, which Scheme as so varied and amended is hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme";
