THE BUTTER AND CREAM MARKETING SCHEME (NORTHERN IRELAND) AMENDMENT (No. 1) ORDER, 1936, DATED 25TH MAY, 1936, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER SECTION 1 (4) OF THE AGRICULTURAL MARKETING ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1933 (23 AND 24 GEO. 5, CH. 22).

## 1936. No. 71.

The Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland, after such consultation as is required by sub-section (4) of section one of the Agricultural Marketing Act (Northern Ireland), 1933, and in exercise of the powers conferred on the said Ministry by the said sub-section, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:—

1. The Butter and Cream Marketing Scheme (Northern Ireland), 1936, as approved by the Butter and Cream Marketing Scheme (Northern Ireland) (Approval) Order, 1936, shall have effect with the following amendment:—

Paragraph 37 of the said Scheme shall be modified to such extent as is necessary in order that the same may be read and have effect as follows:—

"Every registered producer shall contribute to the fund in respect of cream sold by him otherwise than to a creamery registered under the Marketing of Dairy Produce Act (Northern Ireland), 1929, and in respect of butter produced and sold by him a contribution of such amount not exceeding 1d. per gallon of cream and 1/- per cwt. of butter as the Board, with the approval of the Ministry, may determine to be necessary for the operation of this Scheme, or otherwise for the purposes of the Act in its application to this Scheme. Such contributions shall be payable to the Ministry in respect of every month within ten days of the following month, and the Ministry shall pay the same to the Board."

- 2. This Order may be cited as the Butter and Cream Marketing Scheme (Northern Ireland) Amendment (No. 1) Order, 1936, and shall come into operation on the date hereof.
