

Destructive Imported Animals Act (Northern Ireland), 1933, and of every other power in that behalf enabling it, orders and it is hereby ordered as follows :—

Prohibition of the Importation into Northern Ireland or Keeping within Northern Ireland of Grey Squirrels.

1. The importation into and the keeping within Northern Ireland of any animal of the species designated *Sciurus carolinensis* or *Sciura carolinensis*, and commonly known as the Grey Squirrel is hereby prohibited.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of July, 1936.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the Grey Squirrels (Northern Ireland) Order of 1936.

Diseases of Animals : Sheep Dipping.

THE SHEEP DIPPING (SPECIAL REGULATION) ORDER OF 1936,
DATED 17TH JUNE, 1936.

1936. No. 85.

The Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in it under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, as amended and adapted by any subsequent enactments and by every other power enabling it in that behalf orders and it is hereby ordered as follows :—

Prescribed Dippings.

1. All sheep within Northern Ireland during the period from 5th October to 14th November, 1936, shall, with the exceptions as specified in Article 4 of the Sheep Dipping (Northern Ireland) Order of 1932, hereinafter referred to as the principal Order, be dipped on two occasions separated by an interval of not less than seven days or more than fourteen days during that period :

Provided that the foregoing requirement shall not apply to sheep imported into Northern Ireland during the period from 5th October to 14th November, 1936, to which the provisions of Article 8 of the principal Order apply.

Notification of Intention to Dip.

2. For the purpose of enabling the Local Authority or the Police to be represented at the dippings required by the preceding Article whenever they think such a course desirable the owner or person in charge of any sheep required to be dipped shall give such written notice of his intention to dip his sheep as is prescribed by Article 5 of the principal Order.

Declarations by Occupiers of Farms.

3. The occupier of any farm or holding in Northern Ireland on which sheep are kept shall furnish, not later than the 15th December, 1936, to the Sergeant of Police for the police sub-district in which the farm or holding is situate, a declaration to the effect that the sheep in his possession have been double dipped in accordance with this Order. This requirement shall not, however, apply in any case where an Inspector or other officer of the Local Authority shall have certified that the sheep were double dipped as specified in Article I. of this Order in his presence during such period.

Offences.

4. Any person committing or aiding, abetting or counselling or procuring the commission of any breach of the provisions of this Order is liable on summary conviction to the penalties provided by the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1935.

Interpretation.

5. In this Order :

“ Sheep ” includes lambs.

Commencement.

6. This Order shall come into operation on the date hereof.

Short Title.

7. This Order may be cited as the Sheep Dipping (Special Regulation) Order of 1936.
