Sickness Visitation.

REGULATIONS, DATED 20TH DECEMBER, 1937, MADE BY THE NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE JOINT COMMITTEE AND THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER THE NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE ACT, 1936 (26 GEO. 5 AND 1 EDW. 8; C. 32):

1937. No. 145.

The National Health Insurance Joint Committee and the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland acting jointly in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 207 (2) of the National Health Insurance Act, 1936, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf hereby make the following Regulations:—

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the National Health Insurance (Sickness Visitation) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1937.

(2) These Regulations shall have effect as from the first day of January, 1938.

2.—(1) In these Regulations the following expressions have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them:—

“the Act” means the National Health Insurance Act, 1936, as that Act applies in Northern Ireland;

“the Ministry” means the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland;

“Society” means an Approved Society and shall be deemed to include a Registered Branch of an Approved Society;

“ member ” means a person, excluding a person whose permanent place of residence is outside Northern Ireland, in respect of whom the Society is entitled to appropriate to its administration account an amount under paragraph 2 (b) of the Third Schedule to the National Health Insurance (Approved Societies) Regulations, 1930, or under the similar provisions in any Regulations amending or superseding those Regulations ;

“ administration account ” has the meaning assigned to it in Part V of the National Health Insurance (Approved Societies) Regulations, 1930, or in the corresponding Part of any Regulations amending or superseding those Regulations.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1921, applies to the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

3. The expenses incurred in the maintenance of a scheme framed by the Ministry under Section 207 of the Act shall, in so far as they do not exceed the aggregate of the amount received by way of fees charged for specific visits made under that Scheme at the request of Societies, and the amount payable under Regulation 4 hereof, be treated as part of the administration expenses of Societies.

4. For the purpose of meeting any expenses incurred in the maintenance of a scheme framed by the Ministry under Section 207 of the Act in excess of the amount received by way of fees charged for specific visits made under the Scheme at the request of Societies there shall, subject to the provisions of Regulation 5 hereof in each year be applied out of the administration account of each Society, an amount calculated as follows :—

- (i) a sum of threepence in respect of each member ;
- (ii) a further sum of one halfpenny in respect of each member in excess of five thousand ; and
- (iii) a further sum, in addition to those payable under paragraphs (i) and (ii) hereof, of one farthing in respect of each member in excess of ten thousand.

5. Where in any year the aggregate of the sums calculated as provided in Regulation 4 hereof, together with the amount accruing from fees for specific visits made under the aforesaid Scheme at the request of Societies, exceeds the sum required for the maintenance of the Scheme, such excess shall be applied to the reduction of the sum payable per member under paragraph (iii) of Regulation 4 hereof, and any excess remaining after such reduction shall be applied to the reduction of the sum payable under paragraph (ii) of that Regulation.

6. Each Society shall, as and when required by the Ministry so to do, furnish to the Ministry in respect of each year, a statement showing so far as can be ascertained, the number of its members, and the number so furnished shall be the membership of the Society for that year for the purposes of Regulation 4 of these Regulations.

7. The National Health Insurance (Approved Societies) Amendment Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1934 (S.R. & O. of N.I. 1934, No. 56), are hereby revoked but without prejudice to anything duly done or suffered or to any right, privilege, obligation or liability acquired, accrued or incurred thereunder.

NEW INDUSTRIES (DEVELOPMENT).

REGULATIONS, DATED 7TH AUGUST, 1937, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE UNDER SECTION 4 OF THE NEW INDUSTRIES (DEVELOPMENT) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1937.

The Ministry of Commerce for Northern Ireland in conjunction with the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland in exercise of the powers conferred on it by sub-section (6) of section four of the New Industries (Development) Act (Northern Ireland), 1937, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf hereby makes the following regulations, that is to say :—

1. These Regulations shall be cited as the New Industries (Development) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1937.
