

Additional Days and Waiting Period.

ORDER IN COUNCIL, DATED 22ND MARCH, 1937, MADE UNDER THE UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1936 (26 GEO. 5 & 1 EDW. 8, CH. 30).

By the Governor in the Privy Council of Northern Ireland :

WHEREAS by Section 65 of the Unemployment Insurance Act (Northern Ireland), 1936 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") it is provided that in the event of an order being made at any time under Part IV. of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1935, passed by the Parliament of the United Kingdom, for the amendment of any provisions of that Act as applying to Great Britain (hereinafter referred to as a "statutory order"), then, in that event, there shall apply to Northern Ireland so much as the Governor of Northern Ireland by Order in Council declares applicable of the provisions contained in such statutory order :

And whereas it is further provided in the said section that an Order in Council thereunder may make such adaptations of any provisions contained in any statutory order as appear necessary or expedient for carrying into effect the application of those provisions to Northern Ireland, and that as from any date specified in such Order in Council the Act shall have effect subject to the provisions of the statutory order applied to Northern Ireland by such Order in Council :

And whereas a statutory order has been made for the amendment of Sections 31 and 35 of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1935, by increasing the maximum number of additional days of benefit payable in a benefit year, and by reducing the number of days at the commencement of a continuous period of unemployment after which benefit, other than agricultural benefit, becomes payable :

Now, therefore, I, James Albert Edward, Duke of Abercorn, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, Knight of the Most Illustrious Order of Saint Patrick, Governor of Northern Ireland, by and with the advice of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland, in pursuance of the provisions of the said section 65 and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, do hereby declare that so much of the provisions contained in the aforesaid statutory order as provides for such amendment as aforesaid is applicable to Northern Ireland :

And I do hereby order as follows :—

1. For carrying into effect the application of the said provisions to Northern Ireland, paragraph 2 of the said statutory order shall

be adapted to such extent as shall be necessary so that the same may be read and have effect as follows :—

The following amendments shall be made in the Unemployment Insurance Act (Northern Ireland), 1936 :—

- (a) In paragraph (b) of subsection (2) of section 32 (which provides for the computation of additional days of benefit) for the expression “for every five days” there shall be substituted the expression “for every eight days.”
- (b) In subsection (6) of section 32 (which provides for the payment of benefit after the first week of a continuous period of unemployment) there shall be inserted at the beginning the following :—

“Benefit other than agricultural benefit shall be payable in respect of each week after the first three days of a continuous period of unemployment, and agricultural.”
- (c) In subsection (4) of section 36 (which provides for the reckoning of periods of unemployment) for the expression “the first week” there shall be substituted the expression “the first three days or the first week (as the case may be).”

2. The date as from which the Act is to have effect subject to the provisions of the statutory order applied as aforesaid is the date hereof.

Provided that—

- (1) Nothing contained in sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph 2 of the statutory order applied as aforesaid shall affect the computation of the maximum number of additional days in any benefit year which began before the 1st January, 1937; and
- (2) Nothing contained in sub-paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 of the statutory order applied as aforesaid shall entitle any person to receive benefit in respect of any day before the 25th March, 1937, to which he would not have been entitled if this Order had not been made.

3.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Unemployment Insurance (Additional Days and Waiting Period) Order (Northern Ireland), 1937.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1921, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Benefit Regulations.

THE UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE (BENEFIT MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS, (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1937, DATED 15TH MARCH, 1937, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER THE UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1936 (26 GEO. 5 AND 1 EDW. 8, CH. 30).

The Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland by virtue of the powers conferred on it by Section 36 of the Unemployment Insurance Act (Northern Ireland), 1936, and of all other powers in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations :—

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Unemployment Insurance (Benefit Miscellaneous Provisions) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1937, and shall be read as one with the Unemployment Insurance (Benefit Miscellaneous Provisions) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1934 and 1936, and these Regulations and the Unemployment Insurance (Benefit Miscellaneous Provisions) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1934 and 1936, may be cited together as the Unemployment Insurance (Benefit Miscellaneous Provisions) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1934 to 1937.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1921, applies to the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

(3) These Regulations shall have effect from the 24th February, 1937.

2. Regulation 4 of the Unemployment Insurance (Benefit Miscellaneous Provisions) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1934, shall be amended as follows :—
