THE SUMMARY JURISDICTION (PETTY SESSIONS ORDER), DATED 15TH APRIL, 1937.

1937. No. 31.

Whereas by Sub-section 1 of Section 11 of the Summary Jurisdiction and Criminal Justice Act (Northern Ireland), 1935, it is provided that the Ministry of Home Affairs may from time to time by Order declare that from such date as may be specified in that behalf in the Order, two or more Petty Sessions districts, whether they are all situate in the same County or not, shall be served by one and the same person as Petty Sessions Clerk:

And whereas it appears to the Ministry to be desirable that the Petty Sessions districts of Comber, Newtownards and Newtownbreda, shall be served by one and the same person as Petty Sessions Clerk; and that the Petty Sessions districts of Bangor, Donaghadee and Holywood shall be served by one and the same person as Petty Sessions Clerk:

Now, therefore, the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland in pursuance of the powers vested in it by Section 11 of the Summary Jurisdiction and Criminal Justice Act (Northern Ireland), 1935, hereby orders as follows:—

From and after the 20th day of May, 1937—

(1) the Petty Sessions districts of Comber, Newtownards and Newtownbreda shall be served by one and the same person as Petty Sessions Clerk;

(2) the Petty Sessions districts of Bangor, Donaghadee and Holywood shall be served by one and the same person as Petty Sessions Clerk.

This Order may be cited as the Summary Jurisdiction (Pettv Sessions districts) Order (Northern Ireland), 1937.
