1938, shall hold office for a period of two years until the thirty-first day of May, 1940, and thereafter every member so appointed or elected as the case may be shall hold office for a period of two years commencing on the 1st day of June in the year of appointment or election:

Provided that a person appointed or elected to fill a casual vacancy shall hold office for so long as the person in whose place he is appointed or elected would have held office.

- 3. A member of the Council whose term of office expires, or who resigns his office, shall be eligible for further appointment or election.
- 4. An elected member of the Council shall cease to hold office—
 - (a) if he delivers to the Council a written resignation of his office and the resignation is accepted by the Council, or, if not accepted, is not withdrawn within seven days; or
 - (b) if he is detained for more than seven days in any place under any enactment in force in any part of the United Kingdom relating to persons of unsound mind; or
 - (c) if he is adjudged bankrupt or goes into a composition with his creditors; or
 - (d) if the Council by resolution declare that he has been absent from six consecutive meetings of the Council without reasonable excuse.

Paragraphs (a), (b) and (c) of this rule shall apply to members of the Council appointed by the Minister of Agriculture or by the Pigs Marketing Board.

5. These Rules may be cited as the Pig Industry Council (Term and Conditions of Office of Members) Rules (Northern Ireland), 1937.

THE PIGS MARKETING (NORTHERN IRELAND) (SPECIAL LEVY) (No. 1) ORDER, 1937, DATED 17TH JULY, 1937, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER SECTION 7 (3) OF THE AGRICULTURAL MARKETING ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1933 (23 AND 24 GEO. 5, CH. 22).

Whereas by sub-section (3) of Section Seven of the Agricultural Marketing Act (Northern Ireland), 1933 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") it is provided *inter alia* that the Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") may by order require the Board administering a scheme regulating the marketing of an agricultural product to impose a special levy or levies for the purpose of covering any loss which the Board have experienced in trading under the scheme:

And whereas the Pigs Marketing Board (Northern Ireland) (hereinafter referred to as "the Board") are the Board administering the Pigs Marketing Scheme (Northern Ireland), 1933, being a scheme for the time being in force under the Act, and have experienced a loss in trading under the said scheme estimated at £22,600 during the period 1st June, 1937, to 17th July, 1937, inclusive:

Now, therefore, the Ministry, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by the said sub-section and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order, that is to say:—

- 1. The Board shall, during the period 19th July, 1937, to 16th October, 1937, inclusive, for the purpose of meeting the aforementioned loss, impose a special levy of two shillings per pig upon all producers in the case of all sales of pigs by them to a curer or to the Board.
- 2. This Order may be cited as the Pigs Marketing (Northern Ireland) (Special Levy) (No. 1) Order, 1937, and shall come into force on the 19th day of July, 1937.
