

“ Inspector ” means an Inspector or other authorised officer of the Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland ;

“ Importer ” includes any person who, whether as owner, consignor, or consignee, agent or broker, is in possession of, or in any wise entitled to the custody or control of the article ;

“ Plant ” means living plant and parts thereof (except seeds) for planting.

Short Title:

6. This Order may be cited as the Importation of Plants (Northern Ireland) (Amendment) Order of 1937, and the Importation of Plants (Northern Ireland) Orders of 1933 to 1936, and this Order may be cited together as the Importation of Plants (Northern Ireland) Orders of 1933 to 1937.

REGULATIONS, DATED THIRTY-FIRST DAY OF AUGUST, 1937, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE, NORTHERN IRELAND, AFTER CONSULTATION WITH THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 99 OF THE EDUCATION ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1923 (13 AND 14 GEO. V, CH. 21) AS APPLIED BY THE ORDER DATED 29TH DAY OF MAY, 1925, OF THE GOVERNOR OF NORTHERN IRELAND IN COUNCIL AND LAID BEFORE PARLIAMENT IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE SAID PROVISIONS.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Agricultural Teachers (Amending) Regulations, 1937, and shall be read as one with the Regulations dated 9th June, 1925 (hereinafter called the Principal Regulations) and the Agricultural Teachers (Amending) Regulations, 1936, made by the Ministry of Agriculture (Northern Ireland) governing the certification, recognition, terms of employment and remuneration of teachers in agricultural subjects (Statutory Rules and Orders of Northern Ireland, 1925, No. 66, and 1936, No. 143) and those Regulations and these Regulations may be cited together as the Agricultural Teachers Regulations 1925 to 1937.

2. That part of Article 2 of the Agricultural Teachers (Amending) Regulations, 1936, which substitutes scales of salary is hereby revoked and the salaries of agricultural teachers shall as from the 1st August, 1937, be in accordance with the scales of salary set out in Article 14 of the Principal Regulations, subject to the modification that the following shall be substituted for paragraph D of the said Article :—

North West School	£250—£10—£350.	

3. There shall be added after the words " Teachers in Agriculture " in paragraph B of Article 14 of the Principal Regulations the words " and Agricultural Organisers."

4. The salary of every teacher to whom the provisions of the Regulations for Agricultural Teachers, 1925 (Amending) Regulations No. 2, 1931, and the Agricultural Teachers (Amending) Regulations, 1936, applied, shall be increased as from 1st August, 1937, by such an amount as will give the teacher a salary equal to that which would on that date have been payable had that salary not been subject to the provisions of the aforementioned Regulations.
