REGULATIONS, DATED 5TH JULY, 1938, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE WITH THE CONCURRENCE OF THE LORD CHIEF JUSTICE AND THE SPEAKERS OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF COMMONS OF NORTHERN IRELAND IN PURSUANCE OF THE RULES PUBLICATION ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1925.

The Ministry of Finance, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by sections one and two of the Rules Publication Act (Northern Ireland), 1925 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), and with the concurrence of the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland and the Speakers of the Senate and the House of Commons of Northern Ireland as required by the Act, hereby makes the following Regulation :—

It is hereby prescribed in accordance with sub-section 3 (b) of section two of the Act that statutory rules made by the Ministry of Agriculture under section one of the Marketing of Eggs Act (Northern Ireland), 1936, determining from week to week the prices to be paid for eggs by wholesale dealers shall be exempted from the provisions of sub-sections (1) and (2) of section one of the Act.

WHEREAS by Sub-section 1 of Section 11 of the Summary Jurisdiction and Criminal Justice Act (Northern Ireland), 1935, it is provided that the Ministry of Home Affairs may from time to time by Order declare that from such date as may be specified in
