- (b) Jute, hemp, flax or other cloth on both sides of which the words "Imported Meat" have been painted, printed or stencilled in indelible red or black colouring in letters of at least 3 inches in height in such a manner that the words appear in continuous lines not more than 12 inches apart; or
- (c) Stockinette; or
- (d) Paper.

Amendment of Articles 2 and 3 of principal Order.

2. The references in Articles 2 and 3 of the principal Order to any cloth mentioned in paragraph (a) of Article I (1) of that Order shall be construed as references to any cloth mentioned in paragraphs (a) and (b) of Article I (1) of the principal Order as amended by this Order.

Commencement and Short Title.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the twentieth day of December, nineteen hundred and thirty-nine, and may be cited as the Importation of Wrapping Materials (Northern Ireland) (Amendment) Order of 1939.

Whereas by Section Twenty-seven of the Bacon Industry Act (Northern Ireland), 1939 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is provided that the Act shall come into operation on the appointed day; that the appointed day for the purposes of the Act shall be such day as the Minister of Agriculture may appoint, and that different days may be appointed for different purposes and different provisions of the Act.

Now, therefore, I, The Right Honourable Sir Basil Stanlake Brooke, Bart., the Minister of Agriculture for Northern Ireland, hereby order and direct as follows:—

The provisions of Section 5 of the Act shall come into operation on the first day of September, nineteen hundred and thirty-nine, provided that the Ministry may, at any time subsequent to the date hereof, register contracts and agreements for the purposes of that Section and may make a prescription as provided for by subsection (7) of that Section.

The provisions of sub-sections (1) and (4) of Section 17 shall come into operation on the first day of September, nineteen hundred and thirty-nine, provided that the Pigs Marketing Board may at any time subsequent to the date hereof make, with the approval of the Ministry, a Determinaton as provided for by the said sub-section (4).

The provisions of Section 18 shall come into operation on the first day of September, nineteen hundred and thirty-nine.

The provisions of Section 19 shall come into operation on the first day of September, nineteen hundred and thirty-nine, provided that the Ministry may at any time subsequent to the date hereof make prescriptions for the purposes of sub-sections (2) and (3) of that Section.

The remaining provisions of the Act, with the exception of the provisions of sub-sections (2) and (3) of Section 17, shall come into operation on the date hereof.
