25	Regulations to be laid before Parliament.	<p>Regulations made under the Trade Boards Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, as applied for the purposes of the Holidays with Pay Act (Northern Ireland), 1938, shall, as soon as may be after they are made, be laid before each House of Parliament. If either House within the statutory period next after such regulation made as aforesaid has been laid before such House, resolves that the regulation shall be annulled, the regulation shall, after the date of the resolution, be void, but without prejudice to the validity of anything previously done thereunder or to the making of a new regulation.</p> <p>In this section the expression "statutory period" means a period comprising five days at least on which the Senate or House of Commons (as the case may require) has sat, but not being in any case shorter in duration than ten days, such days being reckoned without regard to the question whether they are comprised in one or in more than one session of Parliament.</p>

REGULATIONS, DATED 29TH SEPTEMBER, 1939, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR UNDER THE UNEMPLOYMENT ASSISTANCE (EMERGENCY POWERS) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1939.

1939. No. 138.

The Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland, by virtue of the powers conferred on it by the Unemployment Assistance (Emergency Powers) Act (Northern Ireland), 1939, and of all other powers in that behalf, hereby, with the approval of the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland, makes the following Regulations :—

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Unemployment Assistance (Appeal Tribunals) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1939, and shall come into force on the date hereof.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1921, applies to the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

(3) In these Regulations the expression "the Act" means the Unemployment Assistance Act (Northern Ireland), 1934, as amended by any subsequent enactments.

2.—Notwithstanding anything contained in the Fifth Schedule to the Act (which relates to the constitution and proceedings of appeal tribunals) a person appointed by the Minister of Labour for Northern Ireland under that Schedule as chairman of an appeal tribunal or a person so appointed to act as chairman in the unavoidable absence or incapacity of the chairman shall be deemed to constitute an appeal tribunal for all the purposes of the Act : Appeal
Tribunals

Provided that, if the chairman, or in his unavoidable absence or incapacity the person appointed to act as chairman, is of opinion that having regard to the nature of the questions raised in any case and to all the other circumstances it is desirable that either a person representing workpeople, or a person representing the Board, or both, appointed in accordance with paragraph 3 of the said Schedule should be present when that case is determined he may adjourn the hearing thereof so as to enable such person or persons to attend accordingly and if at such adjourned hearing that person or those persons is or are present the appeal tribunal shall in such case consist of the chairman or person appointed to act as chairman and such person or persons.
