REGULATIONS, DATED 25TH OCTOBER, 1939, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION UNDER SECTION 99 OF THE EDUCATION ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1923.

## 1939. No. 177.

The Secondary School Examinations Regulations, 1935, Statutory Rules and Orders of Northern Ireland, 1935, No. 45 (hereinafter called the "Principal Regulations"), are hereby amended as follows:—

- 1.—These Regulations may be cited as "The Secondary School Examinations Regulations, Amending Regulations, No. 3."
- 2.—Regulation 16 of the Principal Regulations is hereby repealed and the following Regulation is substituted therefor:—
  - "16.—The Ministry reserves to itself the right to accept or to refuse any application received after the date mentioned in Regulation 14 hereof, and in the event of such late application being accepted, to charge, in addition to the ordinary fee, a late fee of ten shillings: Provided that no application received after the 30th April in the year in which the examination is to be held shall be accepted."
- 3.—These Regulations shall come into operation and have effect as from 1st August, 1939, after which date they shall be read with and as forming part of the Principal Regulations.
