Saturday Exception.

REGULATIONS, DATED 29TH DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1940, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR UNDER SECTION 94 OF THE FACTORIES ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1938.

1940. No. 20.

The Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by Section 94 of the Factories Act (Northern Ireland), 1938, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1.—The classes or descriptions of factory specified in the Schedule to these Regulations are hereby granted a special exception authorising the occupier of every such factory to substitute some other day for Saturday as the short day, and, as respects factories of the classes or descriptions specified in Part II of the said Schedule in which the work by reason of the nature thereof requires to be carried on on six full working days in the week, authorising the substitution of some other day for Saturday in respect of some of the women and young persons employed therein.

2.—Where some other day is substituted for Saturday in respect of some only of the women and young persons employed in the factory, then either—

- (i) the notice under Section 101 of the Act shall give the names of the women and young persons in respect of whom such substitution is made; or
- (ii) the said notice shall specify the classes or sets of persons in respect of whom such substitution is made, and, if the Chief Inspector so requires, there shall be kept posted in the factory, adjacent to the said notice, lists showing the names of the women and young persons in each such class or set.

3.—The Orders made by the Secretary of State on the 26th December, 1907(a), and the 3rd February, 1902(b), under Section 43 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901(c), are hereby revoked so far as they relate to Northern Ireland.

4.—These Regulations may be cited as the Factories (Saturday Exception) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1940, and shall come into force on the 1st March, 1940.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

Factories in which the business is carried on in connection with a retail shop on or immediately adjoining the factory premises.

Factories, not being textile factories as defined in Section 118 (6) of the Act, in which is carried on the making, repairing or renovating of any article of wearing apparel.

Factories in which is carried on the making of any article of food or drink.

Laundries.

Factories in which is carried on the developing or printing of photographs.

PART II.

Factories in which is carried on the manufacture of bread or flour confectionery (including meat and fruit pies)
Newspaper printing offices.

Factories in which the repair, cleaning or washing of motor vehicles or cycles is carried on.

Factories in which the business of a florist is carried on.
