which are not required for the operation of the Scheme or otherwise for the purposes of the enactments applicable to the Scheme shall be applied for the benefit of the pig producing industry in such manner as the Ministry of Agriculture (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") may by order direct:

AND WHEREAS by section twenty-three of the Act it is provided that the Ministry may make regulations prescribing anything which is to be prescribed:

Now, THEREFORE, the Ministry, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by the said Schedule and section of the Act and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order, that is to say:—

- 1.—The Board shall, in respect of the period 1st March, 1941, to 28th February, 1942, pay the sum of £300 to the Trustees of The Agricultural Research Institute of Northern Ireland, Hillsborough, County Down, in respect of research in pig nutrition, and such payment shall be made within two months from the date of commencement of this Order.
- 2.—This Order may be cited as the Bacon Industry (Pig Nutrition Research Grant) (No. 2) Order (Northern Ireland), 1941, and shall come into operation on the date hereof.

ORDER, DATED 31ST MAY, 1941, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS UNDER SECTION 5 OF THE DETERMINATION OF NEEDS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1941.

1941. No. 112.

WHEREAS it is provided amongst other things by Section 3 of the Determination of Needs Act (Northern Ireland), 1941, (hereinafter called "the Act") that in computing the resources of any person whose

resources are taken into account in determining the needs of any person for the purposes of sub-section (1) of Section 2 of the Blind Persons Act, 1920, any money and investments treated as capital assets of that person shall, up to the amount specified in the said section, be disregarded, and that the said Section 3 of the Act shall come into force on the appointed day:

AND WHEREAS it is provided by Section 5 of the Act that the appointed day in relation to sub-section (1) of Section 2 of the Blind Persons Act, 1920, means such date as may be appointed by order of the Ministry of Home Affairs:

Now therefore the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland hereby orders as follows, that is to say:—

- 1. The Second day of June, 1941, shall be the appointed day for the coming into force of Section 3 of the Determination of Needs Act (Northern Ireland), 1941.
- 2. This Order may be cited as the Blind Persons Determination of Needs (Appointed Day) Order (Northern Ireland), 1941.
