ORDER, DATED SEPTEMBER 23RD, 1941, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER THE OATS (CONTROL AND MAXIMUM PRICES) (NORTHERN IRELAND) ORDER, 1941.

1941. No. 167.

The Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland in pursuance of Article 15 of the Oats (Control and Maximum Prices) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1941 (a), hereby orders as follows :—

1.—Except under and in accordance with the terms of a licence granted by or on behalf of the Ministry, no person shall export from Northern Ireland any oats.

2.—This Order shall come into force on the 23rd day of September, 1941.

3.—This Order may be cited as the Oats (Exports) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1941.

ORDER, DATED 19TH JUNE, 1941, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF PUBLIC SECURITY FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER REGULATION 29B OF THE DEFENCE (GENERAL) REGULATIONS, 1939.

1941. No. 124.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on it by Regulation 29B of the Defence (General) Regulations, 1939, the Ministry of Public Security for Northern Ireland hereby orders as follows :—

1.—Subject as hereinafter provided, any person who is on or after the date of this Order employed as a Constable in the Royal Ulster Constabulary is required to continue in such employment until his services are dispensed with in accordance with the provisions of Article 2 of this Order.

2.—The services of any person employed as aforesaid may be dispensed with—

- (i) in a case where the person has given notice of his desire that his services should be dispensed with, by the Inspector General of the Royal Ulster Constabulary :
- (ii) in any other case, in accordance with the provisions of section 2 of the Constabulary Act (Northern Ireland), 1922.

3.—Paragraph (1A) of Regulation 29B of the said Regulations (which paragraph relates to disobedience to lawful orders and absence from duty) shall apply to any person employed as aforesaid.

4.—This Order may be cited as the Police (Employment and Offences) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1941.

ORDER, DATED 4TH JULY, 1941, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF PUBLIC SECURITY FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER REGULATION 29B OF THE DEFENCE (GENERAL) REGULATIONS, 1939.

1941. No. 131.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on it by Regulation 29B of the Defence (General) Regulations, 1939, the Ministry of Public Security for Northern Ireland hereby orders as follows :—

1.—Subject as hereinafter provided, any person who, on or after the date of this Order, is employed as a member of the Royal Ulster Constabulary, shall continue in such employment until his services are dispensed with in accordance with the provisions of Article 2 of this Order.

2.—The services of any person employed as aforesaid may be dispensed with—

- (i) in a case where the person has given notice of his desire that his services should be dispensed with, by the Inspector General of the Royal Ulster Constabulary ;
- (ii) in any other case, in accordance with the provisions of section 2 of the Constabulary Act (Northern Ireland), 1922.

3.—Paragraph (1A) of Regulation 29B of the said Regulations (which paragraph relates to disobedience to lawful orders and absence from duty) shall apply to any person employed as aforesaid.
