Carriage of Workers.

ORDER, DATED 27TH AUGUST, 1941, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER REGULATION 73 OF THE DEFENCE (GENERAL) REGULATIONS, 1939.

1941. No. 156.

The Ministry of Home Affairs by virtue of the powers conferred on the Secretary of State by paragraph 2 of Regulation 73 of the Defence (General) Regulations, 1939, and delegated to the said Ministry by the Delegation of Emergency Powers (Northern Ireland) Order, 1940, hereby orders and directs as follows :—

- 1.—Where a vehicle is being used on a public highway for the conveyance of persons engaged on work essential for the defence of the realm or the efficient prosecution of the war then in any proceedings which may be taken in respect of the use of such vehicle in contravention of section 11 of the Motor Vehicles (Traffic and Regulation) Act, 1926, (as amended by section 6 of the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic Act (Northern Ireland), 1929), it shall be a defence to prove that the vehicle was, on that occasion, being used under an authority granted specially for the purpose by the Ministry of Home Affairs.
- 2.—The authority referred to in the foregoing article shall be in the form in the schedule hereto or in a form to the like effect and shall be carried by the driver of the vehicle to which the authority relates.
- 3.—Any authority granted as aforesaid shall remain in force until revoked or suspended by the Ministry of Home Affairs.

This Order may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Defence) (Carriage of Workers) (Northern Ireland), Order, 1941.

Certificates for Essential Services.

ORDER, DATED 14TH JANUARY, 1941, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER PARAGRAPH (4) OF REGULATION 73 OF THE DEFENCE (GENERAL) REGULATIONS, 1939.

1941. No. 13.

The Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry"), by virtue of the powers conferred on the Secretary of State by paragraph (4) of Regulation 73 of the Defence (General) Regulations, 1939, and delegated to the said Ministry by the Delegation of Emergency Powers (Northern Ireland) Order, 1940, hereby makes the following Order:—

1.—A certificate issued in pursuance of paragraph (4) of Regulation 73 shall be—

- (a) in the case of a vehicle being used for the purposes of His Majesty's Service, in the form specified in Schedule I to this Order and signed by the user of the vehicle or by some duly authorised person in his behalf;
- (b) in any other case in the form specified in Schedule II to this Order signed on behalf of the Ministry in connection with a service designated in paragraph 3 hereof.

2.—The certificate shall be affixed in a conspicuous place on the inside of the windscreen of the vehicle.
