The Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland by virtue of the powers conferred on it by Regulation 70 of the Defence (General) Regulations, 1939, hereby makes the following order:

- 1.—No person shall drive or cause to be driven any vehicle at a speed exceeding 20 miles per hour on the following lengths of road:—
 - (a) that portion of the main road from Belfast to Crumlin in the County of Antrim from the junction of the townland boundaries of Ballyhill Lower, Ballykennedy and Boltnaconnell in a westerly direction to a point approximately one-half mile east of Dundesert Bridge in the townland of Dundesert;
 - (b) that portion of the main road from Muckamore to Dundrod in the County of Antrim from the junction of the townland boundaries of Aughnamullan and Ballykennedy in a northwesterly direction to Straidhavern School in the townland of Straidhavern.
- 2.—This order may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Defence) (County Antrim Speed Limit) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1941.

The Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland by virtue of the powers conferred on it by Regulation 70 of the Defence (General) Regulations, 1939, hereby makes the following Order:—

- 1.—No person shall drive or cause to be driven any vehicle at a speed exceeding 20 miles per hour on the following lengths of road:—
 - (a) That portion of the main road running from Londonderry to Limavady from a point 700 yards east of Broad Bridge for a distance of approximately 1,000 yards to a point 600 yards west of St. Mary's Roman Catholic Church.
