

- (b) The road running from St. Canice's Church in the townland of Muff to its junction with the main road running from Londonderry to Limavady in the townland of Drummaheeny.

2.—No person shall drive or cause to be driven any vehicle at a speed exceeding 10 miles per hour on the following length of road :—

That portion of the road running in a north-easterly direction from the main road running from Londonderry to Limavady at Longfield Lodge for a distance of approximately 300 yards.

3.—This Order may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Defence) (County Londonderry Speed Limit) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1941.

ORDER, DATED 24TH DECEMBER, 1941, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER REGULATION 70 OF THE DEFENCE (GENERAL) REGULATIONS, 1939.

1941. No. 209.

The Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland by virtue of the powers conferred on it by Regulation 70 of the Defence (General) Regulations, 1939, hereby makes the following Order :—

1.—No person shall drive or cause to be driven any vehicle at a speed exceeding 30 miles per hour on the following length of road :—

That portion of the road running from Newtownards to Comber from a point 230 yards south of Carleton Bridge in the townland of Corporation South for a distance of 1620 yards.

2.—This Order may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Defence) (County Down Speed Limit) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1941.
