

4.—The bonus shall be payable in respect of recognised service rendered on and after 1st April, 1940, and shall not be reckonable for the purposes of the Superannuation Scheme.

5.—In respect of any period of absence for which under Article 50 of the Principal Regulations a teacher is entitled to remuneration at only half the minimum rate of salary payable to him under those Regulations the War Bonus payable to him by the Governing Body in respect of that period of absence shall be at the rate of one-half of the bonus which would normally be payable to him.

6.—The Ministry shall pay to the Governing Body a War Bonus Grant equal to the amount of war bonus paid by the Governing Body in accordance with these regulations.

7.—These Regulations shall henceforth be construed with and as forming part of the Principal Regulations.

REGULATIONS, DATED 14TH NOVEMBER, 1941, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION, NORTHERN IRELAND, UNDER SECTION 77 OF THE EDUCATION ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1923.

1941. No. 212.

1.—These Regulations may be cited as “The Regulations for Secondary Teachers, Northern Ireland, 1937, No. 2 Amending Regulations, No. 2, 1941.”

2.—The Regulations for Secondary Teachers, Northern Ireland, 1937, No. 2 (Statutory Rules and Orders of Northern Ireland, 1937, No. 89), hereinafter called the Principal Regulations, are hereby amended as follows :—

3.—Regulation 26 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by the addition of the following after sub-section (h)—

(j) In the case of a school in which there has been in the preceding year or years a decline in the number of pupils of six years of age or over on the roll, due to circumstances arising out of the war, the average number of pupils on the roll for the purpose of Articles 26 and 27 of the Principal Regulations shall be

deemed to be a number to be determined by the Ministry after consideration of all relevant circumstances and of the number of pupils of six years of age and over on the roll of the school for each of the three school years immediately preceding that in which the decline occurs.

4.—These regulations shall come into operation and have effect as from 1st August, 1940, after which date they shall be read with and as forming part of the Principal Regulations.

Technical Schools and Classes : Attendance Grants.

REGULATIONS, DATED 16TH OCTOBER, 1941, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION, NORTHERN IRELAND, UNDER SECTION 77 OF THE EDUCATION ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1923.

1941. No. 185.

1.—These Regulations may be cited as the Technical Attendance Grants Regulations, 1932, Amending Regulations, No. 3, 1941.

2.—The Technical Attendance Grants Regulations, (Statutory Rules and Orders of Northern Ireland, 1932, No. 47), hereinafter called the Principal Regulations, are hereby amended as follows :—

3.—The Ministry may pay a proportion of the grant normally payable under Article 16 of the Principal Regulations in respect of a student who was not enrolled in a recognised junior technical or junior commercial school at the beginning of the school year or who ceased to attend a recognised junior technical or junior commercial school before the end of the school year upon written application being made to the Ministry by the Principal or other competent authority of the school in which the pupil was enrolled giving satisfactory reasons why the pupil was not on the roll of a recognised junior technical or junior commercial school throughout the school year.

The proportion of grant payable will be at the rate of one-third of the grant payable under Article 16 of the Principal Regulations in respect of a student who made 50 attendances during the first 65 days on which the school was open during the school year, and at the rate of two-thirds of the grant payable under Article 16 of the Principal
