

7.—(1) Subject as hereinafter provided, where a transferred fireman is discharged on medical grounds, the certificate of the certifying authority shall be conclusive as to whether or not his incapacity was occasioned in the execution of his duty.

(2) In giving or withholding any such certificate, the certifying authority shall act, in relation to the question in the preceding paragraph of this regulation which requires to be determined on medical grounds, on the evidence of some duly qualified medical practitioner or practitioners selected by the Ministry.

(3) Where for the purposes of this regulation any person is medically examined by a medical practitioner selected by the Ministry and is dissatisfied with the opinion of that practitioner or any medical question, such person may appeal to a medical referee appointed by the Minister of Public Security for Northern Ireland from a panel of medical practitioners nominated by the Faculty of Medicine, Queen's University, Belfast, and the certifying authority shall be bound by the decision of any medical question which is determined on any such appeal, and shall, if necessary, issue an amended certificate accordingly.

(4) A certificate of the certifying authority given for the purposes of the preceding regulation as to the grounds on which or the circumstances in which a transferred fireman was discharged shall be conclusive for the purposes of the local Act that he was discharged on the grounds, or in the circumstances, stated in the certificate.

Prohibition of Processions.

ORDER, DATED 7TH OCTOBER, 1942, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF PUBLIC SECURITY UNDER SECTION ONE OF THE MINISTRIES ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1940.

1942. No. 162.

WHEREAS it is provided by Sub-Section (2) of Section One of the Ministries Act (Northern Ireland), 1940, that the Ministry of Public Security for Northern Ireland (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") shall have power to issue such Orders as the Minister of Public Security for Northern Ireland may consider necessary for public security, civil defence, the co-ordination of the civil defence services, and the protection of persons and property from injury or damage in the present emergency :

AND WHEREAS the said Minister considers it necessary in the interests of public security and for the purpose of better providing for the protection of persons from injury to prohibit the holding during the present emergency of processions (other than funerals) in public places in Northern Ireland :

NOW, THEREFORE, the Ministry, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the said Section One, hereby orders as follows :—

1.—Subject to the provisions of this Order, the holding in any public place in Northern Ireland of any procession (other than a funeral) is hereby prohibited.

2.—Subject to the provisions of this Order, no person shall organise, hold or take part in any such procession in any public place in Northern Ireland.

3.—(1) This Order shall not apply—

(a) to members of any of His Majesty's Forces or Police Officers or Constables or members of any civil defence organisation acting as such in the course of their duty ;

or

(b) to any procession for the holding of which an authorisation in writing has been given by the Ministry : provided that an authorisation shall not be given for any procession other than a procession in respect of which the Ministry is satisfied that the holding thereof is for an object directly connected with, or likely to further, the more effective prosecution of the war ;

or

(c) to members of the Salvation Army when proceeding to or from a religious service.

(2) The Ministry may delegate its power to give such authorisation as aforesaid to any Officer of the Royal Ulster Constabulary holding a rank not lower than the rank of District Inspector.

4.—In this Order the expression " public place " means any highway, public park or garden and any public bridge, road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not, and includes any unenclosed space to which, for the time being, the public have or are permitted to have access.

5.—The Interpretation Act, 1921, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

6.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Public Security (Prohibition of Processions) Order (Northern Ireland), 1942.

(2) The Public Security (Prohibition of Processions) Order (Northern Ireland), 1940, and the Public Security (Prohibition of Processions) (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland), 1941, are hereby revoked.

Clogher Valley Railway Compensation Fund.

REGULATIONS, DATED 29TH JANUARY, 1942, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF
FINANCE UNDER SECTION 8 OF THE CLOGHER VALLEY RAILWAY AND
ROADS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1941.

1942. No. 17.

The Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland (in these regulations referred to as "the Ministry") in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section eight of the Clogher Valley Railway and Roads Act (Northern Ireland), 1941, hereby makes the following regulations:—

1. There shall be established a fund which shall be called the Clogher Valley Railway Compensation Fund (in these regulations referred to as "the Fund") and the following provisions of these regulations shall apply to the Fund.

2. The Ministry shall cause to be opened with the Belfast Banking Company limited an account to be known as the Clogher Valley Railway Compensation Fund Account into which all sums payable to the Fund shall be paid and out of which all sums payable out of the Fund shall be paid.

3. An account of the sums paid into, and of the sums paid out of, the Fund shall be prepared by the Ministry and rendered to the Comptroller and Auditor General in respect of each financial year as soon as may be after the 31st day of March in each year and in any case not later than the 30th day of November next following the close of each financial year.

4. These regulations may be cited as the Clogher Valley Railway Compensation Fund Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1942.
