WHEREAS it is provided by the Ministries Act (Northern Ireland), 1940, that the Ministry of Public Security for Northern Ireland (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") shall have power to issue such Orders as the Minister of Public Security for Northern Ireland may consider necessary for public security, civil defence, the co-ordination of the Civil Defence Services and the protection of persons and property from injury or damage in the present emergency :

AND WHEREAS on the Fourth day of July, 1940, the Public Security (Church Bells) Order (Northern Ireland), 1940, (a) was made by the Ministry of Public Security :

AND WHEREAS it is expedient that the said Order should be suspended between the hours of 9 a.m. and 12 noon on Sunday the Fifteenth day of November, 1942 :

NOW, THEREFORE, the Ministry, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by the Ministries Act (Northern Ireland), 1940, hereby orders as follows :

(a) S. R. & O. (N.I.) 1940 No. 63.

1. Notwithstanding anything in the Public Security (Church Bells) Order (Northern Ireland), 1940, church bells may be sounded on Sunday the Fifteenth day of November, 1942, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 12 noon.

2. This Order may be cited as the Public Security (Church Bells) Order (Northern Ireland), 1942.

2. This Order may be cited as the Public Security (Church Bells) (No. 2) Order (Northern Ireland), 1942.
