ABERCORN.

WHEREAS under Regulation 60AC of the Defence (General) Regulations, 1939, as modified in its application to Northern Ireland by paragraph (9B) of Regulation 102 of the said Regulations, certain powers conferred upon a Regional Commissioner by the first-mentioned Regulation are, as respects Northern Ireland, exercisable by such department of the Government of Northern Ireland as the Governor of Northern Ireland may by order specify :

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JAMES ALBERT EDWARD, DUKE OF ABERCORN, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, Knight of the Most Illustrious Order of Saint Patrick, Governor of Northern Ireland, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Regulations, do by this Order specify the Ministry of Home Affairs as the department of the Government of Northern Ireland by which the powers conferred by the said Regulation 60AC shall be exercised.
