The Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland in pursuance of Article 15 of the Oats (Control and Maximum Prices) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1941, (a) (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") hereby orders as follows:—

1.—Notwithstanding anything contained in Article 6 of the principal Order, every approved buyer or person licensed under Article 2 of the Feeding Stuffs (Control) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1941, (b) is hereby authorised to sell, offer or agree to sell, oats grown in Great Britain.

In this Article, the expression "approved buyer" has the meaning assigned to that expression by the principal Order.

2.—This Order shall come into force on the 16th day of February, 1942.

1.—Notwithstanding anything contained in the principal Order, and subject as hereinafter provided, every approved buyer shall, within seven days of the date on which he acquires any oats (not being seed
