

- (b) acquired during the seed season for the purpose of resale as seed oats ; or
- (c) for which the oatmeal miller or the Northern Ireland Port Area Grain Committee, as the case may be, failed to tender payment at the time of delivery ; or
- (d) certified in writing by the Northern Ireland Port Area Grain Committee to be unsuitable for its purpose :

Provided that an approved buyer who has retained any oats in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (a) or (b) of this Article and who has not disposed of such oats during the seed season shall offer such oats for sale in accordance with the provisions of Article 2 of this Order, and for the purpose of such offer the approved buyer shall be deemed to have acquired the said oats on the day following the date of expiration of the seed season.

5.—Any person who has sold or disposed of any oats in accordance with the provisions of Article 2 or 3 of this Order to an oatmeal miller or to the Northern Ireland Port Area Grain Committee, shall deliver such oats within such reasonable time, and to such place as the oatmeal miller or the Northern Ireland Port Area Grain Committee, as the case may be, may require or specify.

6.—In this Order—the expressions “acquire” and “dispose of” include, respectively, the taking and giving of possession, and the expression “appropriate maximum price” means the maximum price for the time being in force under the principal Order.

7.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Oats (Control) (Restriction of Sales) (Northern Ireland) (No. 2) Order, 1942.

(2) This Order shall be construed as one with the principal Order.

(3) This Order shall come into force on the 28th day of September, 1942.

ORDER, DATED 9TH JANUARY, 1942, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE UNDER REGULATION 55 (1) OF THE DEFENCE (GENERAL) REGULATIONS, 1939.

1942. No. 7.

The Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland (in this Order referred to as "the Ministry"), by virtue and in exercise of the powers under paragraph (1) of Regulation 55 of the Defence (General) Regulations, 1939, delegated to it by the Delegation of Emergency Powers (Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland) Order, 1941, (a) made by the Secretary of State under paragraph (1) of Regulation 102A of the Defence (General) Regulations, 1939, hereby orders as follows :—

1.—(1) On the occasion of a sale of grass seeds or clover seeds or of grass and clover seeds, for use by the purchaser in sowing down any land with or without a nurse crop, the seller shall furnish to the purchaser, and the purchaser shall obtain an invoice or other statement in writing showing—

- (a) the name and address of the seller,
- (b) the quantity and description of each kind of seed sold, whether the seeds are mixed before delivery or not,
- (c) the name and address of the purchaser, and
- (d) the date of sale.

(2) The purchaser shall retain the said invoice or statement and shall permit any officer authorised by or on behalf of the Ministry to inspect the same at any time while this order is in force.

2. This Order may be cited as the Grass Seeds (Northern Ireland) Order, 1942.
