## DYEING AND CLEANING.

### Direction.

ORDER, DATED FEBRUARY 26, 1943, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE UNDER THE DYEING AND CLEANING (CONTROL) (NORTHERN IRELAND) ORDER, 1942.

1943. No. 30.

The Ministry of Commerce for Northern Ireland in pursuance of Article I of the Dyeing and Cleaning (Control) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1942, hereby orders and directs as follows :—

1. No person engaged in the business of dyeing and cleaning shall dye or clean or dye and clean or accept for dyeing or cleaning or dyeing and cleaning any articles of the description specified in the Schedule bearing the letters "A.V."

2. The provisions of this Order shall not apply to any person engaged in the business of dyeing and cleaning with whom a contract for the dyeing or cleaning or dyeing and cleaning of such articles has been made by or on behalf of a Government Department.

3. This Order may be cited as the Dyeing and Cleaning (Direction) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1943, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of March, 1943.

**EMPLOYMENT.****Conditions and National Arbitration.**

ORDER, DATED APRIL 21, 1943, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR UNDER REGULATION 58AA OF THE DEFENCE (GENERAL) REGULATIONS, 1939.

1943. No. 74.

The Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") by virtue of the powers conferred on it by Regulation 58AA of the Defence (General) Regulations, 1939, hereby makes the following Order :—

1. The Conditions of Employment and National Arbitration Order (Northern Ireland), 1940, as amended by any subsequent Order, shall have effect as if, after paragraph (4) of article 2 thereof, there were inserted the following paragraphs :—

"(4A). Where a trade dispute exists between a local authority and workmen in their employment and such dispute is referred for settlement by the Ministry to the National Arbitration Tribunal (Northern Ireland) the power of the Tribunal to make an award shall, subject to the provisions of the next following paragraph, include power to require the local authority to observe and perform terms and conditions of employment which are beyond their contractual powers without the consent or approval of the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland and notwithstanding that such consent or approval has not been sought or given ; and upon an award being made by the Tribunal in exercise of the power hereby conferred the due observance and performance thereof by the local authority shall be deemed to be within their powers for all purposes.

(4B) Nothing in this Order shall be construed as empowering the National Arbitration Tribunal (Northern Ireland) to make an award requiring a local authority, as part of the terms and conditions of employment of any workman, to pay to such workman on
