Sale of Swine in Belfast.

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Swine Fever (Belfast) Order, 1936, the Royal Ulster Agricultural Society is hereby permitted to hold its Spring Show and Sale of Swine on the 19th February, 1943, in the Saleyard, the property of Messrs. John Robson, Limited, Stewart Street, Belfast.

Short Title.

2. This Order may be cited as the Swine Fever (Emergency Sale) Order, 1943.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the date hereof.

The Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in it under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1935, as amended and adapted by any subsequent enactments, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, orders and it is hereby ordered as follows :—

Sale of Swine in Londonderry.

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Swine Fever (Londonderry) Order, 1942, the North-West of Ireland Agricultural Society is hereby permitted to hold its Spring Show and Sale of Swine on the 12th March, 1943, in the Cattle Market, Rossville Street, Londonderry.

Short Title.

2. This Order may be cited as the Swine Fever (Emergency Sale) No. 2 Order, 1943.
