

**Road Vehicles : Speed Limit.**

ORDER, DATED 25TH MARCH, 1943, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER REGULATION 70 OF THE DEFENCE (GENERAL) REGULATIONS, 1939.

1943. No. 41.

The Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland by virtue of the powers conferred on it by Regulation 70 of the Defence (General) Regulations, 1939, hereby makes the following order :—

1. No person shall drive or cause to be driven any vehicle at a speed exceeding 20 miles per hour, on the following length of road :—

That portion of Route A2 Limavady to Londonderry, 1200 yards in length, through Ballykelly village commencing at a point about 100 yards west of Drummond House and ending at a point about 200 yards east of Ballykelly school.

2. This Order may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Defence) (County Londonderry) (Ballykelly Speed Limit) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1943.

ORDER, DATED 29TH DAY OF MAY, 1943, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS UNDER REGULATION 70 OF THE DEFENCE (GENERAL) REGULATIONS, 1939.

The Ministry of Home Affairs by virtue of the powers conferred on it by Regulation 70 of the Defence (General) Regulations, 1939, hereby makes the following Order :—

1. No person shall drive or cause to be driven any vehicle at a speed exceeding 20 miles per hour on any of the roads described in the Schedule attached hereto.

2. This Order may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Defence) (County Antrim) (Maghaberry Speed Limit) (Northern Ireland), Order, 1943.
