

in the principal Order defined), in the years nineteen hundred and forty-one, nineteen hundred and forty-two, and nineteen hundred and forty-three, shall be further postponed, respectively, until the years nineteen hundred and forty-five, nineteen hundred and forty-six and nineteen hundred and forty-seven, and the term of office of Commissioners holding office at the date of this Order shall be further extended accordingly.

2. The principal Order, as varied by the Order hereinbefore mentioned, shall have effect as if, for the reference in paragraph (1) of Article 2 thereof to the year nineteen hundred and forty-four, there were substituted a reference to the year nineteen hundred and forty-five.

3. This Order may be cited as the Belfast Harbour Commissioners (Postponement of Elections) (No. 3) Order (Northern Ireland), 1943, and shall be construed as one with the principal Order.

ORDER IN COUNCIL, DATED THE 20TH JULY, 1943, MADE UNDER SECTIONS 2 AND 4 OF THE CHARTERED AND OTHER BODIES (TEMPORARY PROVISIONS) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1940.

BY THE GOVERNOR IN THE PRIVY COUNCIL OF NORTHERN IRELAND.

ABERCORN

WHEREAS by the Conservators of Fisheries (Postponement of Elections) Order (Northern Ireland), 1940 (in this Order referred to as "the principal Order") made under section two of the Chartered and Other Bodies (Temporary Provisions) Act (Northern Ireland), 1940, provision was made for extending the term of office and postponing the date of the elections of the Conservators holding office in the several Boards of Conservators constituted by the Fisheries Act (Northern

Ireland), 1934, for the Ballycastle, Coleraine, Enniskillen and Londonderry Fishery Districts (in this Order referred to as " the Boards ") as in the principal Order appearing :

AND WHEREAS the Boards have made application praying that the Governor of Northern Ireland may be pleased to make a further Order in Council with respect to them for varying the principal Order :

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JAMES ALBERT EDWARD, DUKE OF ABERCORN, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, Knight of the Most Illustrious Order of Saint Patrick, Governor of Northern Ireland, by and with the advice of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by sections two and four of the Chartered and Other Bodies (Temporary Provisions) Act (Northern Ireland), 1940; and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, do hereby order as follows :—

1.—(1) The elections of Conservators to hold office in the Boards which would, apart from the principal Order, have taken place on the seventh day of November, nineteen hundred and forty, shall be further postponed until the seventh day of November, nineteen hundred and forty-five, and the term of office of the Conservators now holding office therein shall be further extended accordingly.

(2) Rule 2 in the Second Schedule to the Fisheries Act (Northern Ireland), 1934 (which requires the returning officer to publish a notice specifying the number of representative members to be elected and to send a copy thereof with a nomination paper to every elector) shall be suspended in its application to the said elections until the year nineteen hundred and forty-five.

2. Any casual vacancy occurring, during the term of office as extended by this Order, among the Conservators holding office in any of the Boards may be filled as provided by sub-section (1) of section seven of the Fisheries Act (Northern Ireland), 1934, at any time before the said term of office comes to an end.

3. This Order may be cited as the Conservators of Fisheries (Postponement of Elections) (No. 2) Order (Northern Ireland), 1943, and shall be construed as one with the principal Order.
